## **FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST**

Thank you for your enquiry which the Scotland Office received on 15 June 2012.

You asked for the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000:

*I would like to request information on how much you have spent in the past three years on any kind of artwork or sculpture; an itemised list of the costs; details of the works; who created them; and whether they are on public display.*

*I would be interested in any information and any document held by your organisation regarding my request.*

The Scotland Office has now completed its search for the information you have requested.

In July 2011 The Scotland Office purchased a print, by ACHICA, dimensions 119 x 84 cm, of *The Complete Robert Burns* at a cost of £39.00. This print is on display in our Edinburgh office. The Scotland Office holds no further detailed information about this print. No other artwork or sculpture has been purchased in the past three years.
