Russian Federation Country Statement

Expose corruption

- We commit to ensuring that national law enforcement agencies and financial intelligence unit have full and effective access to beneficial ownership information for companies and other legal entities registered within their jurisdiction.
- We will take steps to ensure transparency of the beneficial ownership of all companies involved in public contracting.
- We will continue developing integrity principles in sport.
- We will implement the principles of the Open Data Charter.
- We will participate in IMF Fiscal Transparency Evaluation.
- We will sign up to the Common Reporting Standard initiative.

Drive out the culture of corruption

- We will improve legal framework and organisational mechanisms of detecting and preventing conflict of interest in relation to public officials.
- We will strengthen the impact of ethical and moral standards on the adherence of bans, restrictions and requirements, established for the purposes of corruption prevention, by public officials.
- We will enhance the effectiveness of informational, propagandistic and educational measures, intended to establish the atmosphere of zero-tolerance to corruption in the society.
- We will improve the effectiveness of anti-corruption cooperation between public authorities and business community paying special attention to the implementation of the Russian Anti-Corruption Charter for Business.
- We will take particular steps to enhance the effectiveness of corruption prevention in procurement of goods, works and services for provisioning governmental and municipal needs.

International cooperation

 We will support and strengthen central coordinating role of the UN in international anticorruption cooperation and promote the implementation of resolutions and decisions adopted by the sixth Conference of the States Parties to the UN Convention against

- Corruption, including St. Petersburg statement on promoting public-private partnership in prevention of and fight against corruption.
- We will work with others countries, civil society, international organisations to support implementation of the provisions of the UN Convention Against Corruption.
- We will extend the use of international cooperation mechanisms for detection, seizure and return of corrupt assets from foreign jurisdictions.
- We will ensure availability of national competent authority for detection, seizure and return of corrupt assets from foreign jurisdictions.
- We commit to implement bilateral arrangements that will ensure law enforcement and financial intelligence units in one partner country has full and effective access to the beneficial ownership information of companies incorporated in the other partner country.
- We support the development of a global commitment for public country by country reporting on tax information for large multinational enterprises.
- We share the goals of the Addis Tax Initiative.
