An Enduring Covenant Between

Her Majesty's Government

– and –

All those who serve or have served in the Armed Forces of the Crown

And their Families

The first duty of Government is the defence of the realm. Our Armed Forces fulfil that responsibility on behalf of the Government, sacrificing some civilian freedoms, facing danger and, sometimes, suffering serious injury or death as a result of their duty. Families also play a vital role in supporting the operational effectiveness of our Armed Forces. In return, the whole nation has a moral obligation to the members of the Naval Service, the Army and the Royal Air Force, together with their families. They deserve our respect and support, and fair treatment.

Those who serve in the Armed Forces, whether Regular or Reserve, those who have served in the past, and their families, should face no disadvantage compared to other citizens in the provision of public and commercial services. Special consideration is appropriate in some cases, especially for those who have given most such as the injured and the bereaved.

This obligation involves the whole of society: it includes voluntary and charitable bodies, private organisations, and the actions of individuals in supporting the Armed Forces. Recognising those who have performed military duty unites the country and demonstrates the value of their contribution. This has no greater expression than in upholding this Covenant.

Section 1: Principles Of The Armed Forces Corporate Covenant

1.1 We **Dartington Hall** will endeavour in our business dealings to uphold the key principles of the Armed Forces Covenant, which are:

- *no member of the Armed Forces Community should face disadvantage in the provision of public and commercial services compared to any other citizen*
- *in some circumstances special treatment may be appropriate especially for the injured or bereaved.*

Section 2: Demonstrating our Commitment

2.1 Dartington Hall recognises the value serving personnel, reservists, veterans and military families bring to our business. We will seek to uphold the principles of the Armed Forces Covenant, by:

- ***promoting the fact that we are an armed forces-friendly organisation;***
 - inserting a page on the Covenant into handbooks in Guest rooms
- ***seeking to support the employment of veterans young and old;***
 - linking with Career Transition Partnership to advertise vacancies and
 - recognising Military qualifications on applications
- ***striving to support the employment of Service spouses and partners;***
 - advertising vacancies with Recruit for Spouses
 - endeavouring to offer a degree of flexibility in granting leave for Service spouses and partners before, during and after a partner's deployment
- ***seeking to support our employees who choose to be members of the Reserve forces, including by accommodating their training and deployment where possible;***
- ***offering support to our local cadet units, either in our local community or in local schools, where possible;***
 - advertising seasonal positions to Cadets through the Cadet HQs & RFCA
 - offering volunteering opportunities to Cadets through the Cadet HQs
- ***offering a discount to members of the Armed Forces Community;***
 - Linking with Defence Discount Service offering:
 - 10% discount against food and drink purchases in The White Hart Restaurant at Dartington Hall (not in conjunction with any other promotions)
 - 15% discount against our Full Wedding Package (subject to availability and not in conjunction with any other offers)

2.2 We will publicise these commitments through our literature and on our website, setting out how we will seek to honour them and inviting feedback from the Service community and our customers on how we are doing.
