Consideration of the Order will take the form of exchanges of statements of case and comments on statements of case.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert part of Baydon path 2 and bridleway 11 at Baydon House Farm from the Aldbourne Road leading east to Keepers Cottage where broadly south and west to its junction with Baydon bridleway 8 (width OS Grid Reference SU 2787 7773 to SU 2794 7751 4 metres approx length 550 metres) to a route leading from Baydon bridleway 8 at OS Grid Reference SU 2775 7737 east and then south and west beside a belt of mature trees before rejoining Baydon bridleway 8 at OS Grid Reference SU 2781 7713. Width 4 metres approximate length 310 metres and alter the Marlborough and Ramsbury Rural District Council definitive map and statement dated 1952 accordingly.

Within 2 weeks of the start date [by 10 June 2016]

Within 8 weeks of the start date [by 22 July 2016]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation or any other written representation must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies (excluding copies of any supporting documents, although these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to the Authority, the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents, although these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 2 September 2016]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation, the Authority, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who has written to us in respect of the Order must ensure that their comments on any or every other statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of these comments to everyone else.

Any other person wishing to make representations in writing to the Secretary of State in respect of the above Order must do so in line with the timetable set out above.
