WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

Norfolk County Council
(Alpington) Modification Order 2015

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order remains unchanged (21 January 2016).

Consideration of the Order will take the form of a public local inquiry.

The Inquiry will be held at **Alpington Village Hall, Church Road, Alpington, Norwich NR14 7NU** on **Thursday 1 September 2016** at 10.00am.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by adding to them a footpath from Church Meadow at map reference TG2911 0209 and running in a west north westerly direction to map reference TG2908 0210 and then cross field in a south south westerly direction to map reference TG2903 0194 and then westwards to map reference TG2900 0194, and then southwards and then westwards along the field edge to meet with footpath Alpington FP11 at map reference TG2889 0192 in the Parish of Alpington.

Timetable for sending in statements of case and proofs of evidence

Since all parties have already had the opportunity to submit statements of case and comments on those statements, no additional statements are invited.

4 weeks before the date of the inquiry [by 4 August 2016]

The Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their proof of evidence (together with any summary) is received by the Secretary of State. See annex E of the Guidance booklet <https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/rights-of-way-guidance-booklet>

As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of:

- i) the Authority's proof of evidence to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and anyone who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence);
- ii) the applicant's proof of evidence to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone else who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence); and
- iii) all other proofs of evidence to the Authority, the applicant, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone else who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence).

All parties must keep to the timetable set out above and ensure that statements of case and proofs of evidence are received by the Secretary of State on time. Late documents will be returned.
