Thank you for your email of 15 June 2016, asking for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. You asked:

In July 2014 Hellmann Worldwide Logistics were awarded a five year contract to supply freight services to FCO services from 01/11/14 to 01/11/19.

The contract award totalled a spend of £35M but I cannot track the department spend which I assume is over £25k per month via the government website <https://data.gov.uk/dataset/spend-over-25-000-in-fco-services>

Are you able to confirm the monthly spend since business was awarded in 2014.

I can confirm that FCO Services does hold information relevant to your request. Please see the table below.

As you can see from the table there was no spend for November 2014, this was the first month of the service and spend is recorded in December. Spend in October 2014 was set up costs in preparation for November.
