National Partnership Agreement between the National Offender Management Service, NHS England and Public Health England for the Co-Commissioning and Delivery of Healthcare Services in Prisons in England

NOMS, NHS England and Public Health England have jointly agreed to extend The National Partnership Agreement in its current form to April 2017.

In rolling forward the agreement each of the signatories reaffirm their commitment to delivering the shared strategic intentions, joint corporate commitments and mutually agreed developmental priorities set out in the agreement. This activity will be delivered alongside active partnership working to support the co-design of prison healthcare reform and the development of co-commissioning of healthcare services with Executive Governors of reform prisons.

Work will shortly commence to review and further update the agreement to provide for a rolling agreement and take account of organisational and operational changes and developments across all partner agencies since the agreement was last refreshed in 2015. It is anticipated that the review will commence in the autumn in time for the updated agreement to be released for April 2017.
