

# **NOTICE OF ORDER**

## **WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981**

### **SECTION 53**

Devon County Council  
(Bridleway No. 24, Chawleigh) Definitive Map Modification Order 2015

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is **30 September 2016**.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of exchanges of statements of case and comments on statements of case.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by adding to them the Bridleway running from the county road at Southcott Cross for 550 metres eastwards along the hedged lane known as Cloepark or Bluebell Lane to the junction with the county road known as Fiddlecote Lane (GR SS 7077 1169 to SS 7130 1168) in the parish of Chawleigh and administrative district of Mid Devon.

#### **Timetable for sending in statements of case and comments**

**Within 2 weeks of the start date [by 14 October 2016]**

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents, although these will be available to view at the Authority's

offices) to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

**Within 8 weeks of the start date [by 25 November 2016]**

Everyone who has made an objection or representation or any other written representation must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies (excluding copies of any supporting documents, although these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to the Authority, the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents, although these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

**Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 6 January 2017]**

Everyone who has made an objection or representation, the Authority, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who has written to us in respect of the Order must ensure that their comments on any or every other statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of these comments to everyone else.

Any other person wishing to make representations in writing to the Secretary of State in respect of the above Order must do so in line with the timetable set out above.

In fairness to the other parties everyone should keep to the timetable to ensure that statements of case and comments are received on time. Late documents will be returned.

We cannot accept any libellous, racist or abusive comments. Any documents containing such comments will be returned.

This Order is made by Devon County Council under section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the Act") because it appears to that authority that the County of Devon Definitive Map and Statement require modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in sections 53(3)(c)(i) namely, the discovery by the authority of evidence which (when considered with all other relevant evidence available to them) shows that a right of way which is not shown in the map and statement subsists or is reasonably alleged to subsist over land in the area to which the map relates, being a right of way such that the land over which the right subsists is a Bridleway.

The Authority has consulted with every local authority whose area includes the land to which the Order relates. The Devon County Council hereby order that:

1. For the purposes of this order the relevant date is 14 November 2014.
2. The County of Devon Definitive Map and Statement shall be modified as described in the Schedule and shown on the map attached to the Order.
3. This Order shall take effect on the date it is confirmed and may be cited as the Devon County Council (Bridleway No. 24, Chawleigh) Definitive Map Modification Order 2015.

## **SCHEDULE**

### **PART I**

#### **MODIFICATION OF DEFINITIVE MAP**

#### **DESCRIPTION OF WAY TO BE ADDED**

##### **Bridleway No. 24, Chawleigh**

This way lies in the administrative district of Mid Devon and in the civil parish of Chawleigh. The bridleway starts at the junction with the county road at Southcott Cross at point A (GR SS 7077 1169), as shown on plan number HCW/PROW/14/146 and proceeds eastwards along the defined and hedged lane known as Cloepark or Bluebell Lane to the junction with the county road known as Fiddlecott Lane and Footpath No. 5, Chawleigh at point B (SS 7130 1168).

The total length of the way to be added is approximately 550 metres with a width of 3 metres. It is shown on the plan as a broken black line with cross bars in the intervals between points A – B.

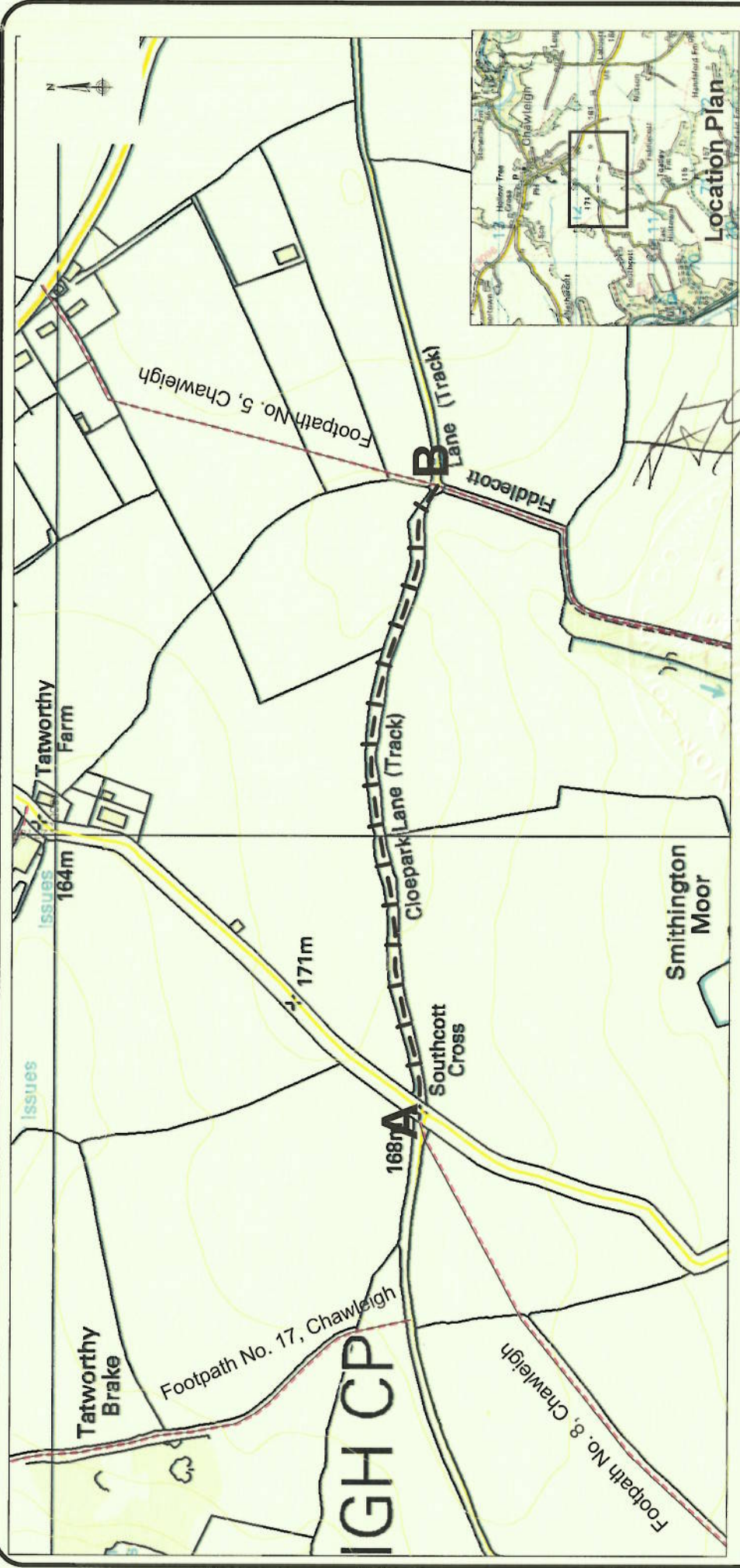
#### **VARIATION OF PARTICULARS OF WAY**

##### **Bridleway No. 24, Chawleigh**

From the County Road at Southcott Cross  
To the County Road known as Fiddlecott Lane

Description – The way is a bridleway. It starts at the junction with the county road at Southcott Cross and proceeds eastwards along the defined and hedged lane known as Cloepark or Bluebell Lane to the junction with the county road known as Fiddlecott Lane and Footpath No. 5, Chawleigh.

The bridleway has a surface of earth and grass, a width of 3 metres and a total length of approximately 550 metres.
