

**1) The percentage of female driving instructors among approved driving instructors (ADIs) in Scotland.**

Our report ran on 12 April 2012 shows that 22.3% of ADIs in Scotland are female.

**2) The percentage of female driving instructors among trainee licence holders and ADIs in Scotland.**

Our report ran on 12 April 2012 shows that 22.5% of trainee licence holders and ADIs in Scotland are female.

**3) The percentage of female driving instructors among the ADIs on the GB ADI register.**

Our report ran on 12 April 2012 shows that 22.4% of current ADIs on the GB ADI register are female.

**4) The percentage of female driving instructors among trainee licence holders and ADIs on the GB ADI register.**

Our report ran on 12 April 2012 shows that 22.8% of current ADIs and trainee licence holders on the GB ADI register are female.

Please note that the information provided is based on the registered address we have for ADIs and trainee licence holders. It may be that some ADIs or trainee licence holders have a registered address in Scotland but don't teach learner drivers in Scotland. Alternatively, it may be that some ADIs or trainee licence holders have a registered address outside of Scotland but teach learner drivers in Scotland.
