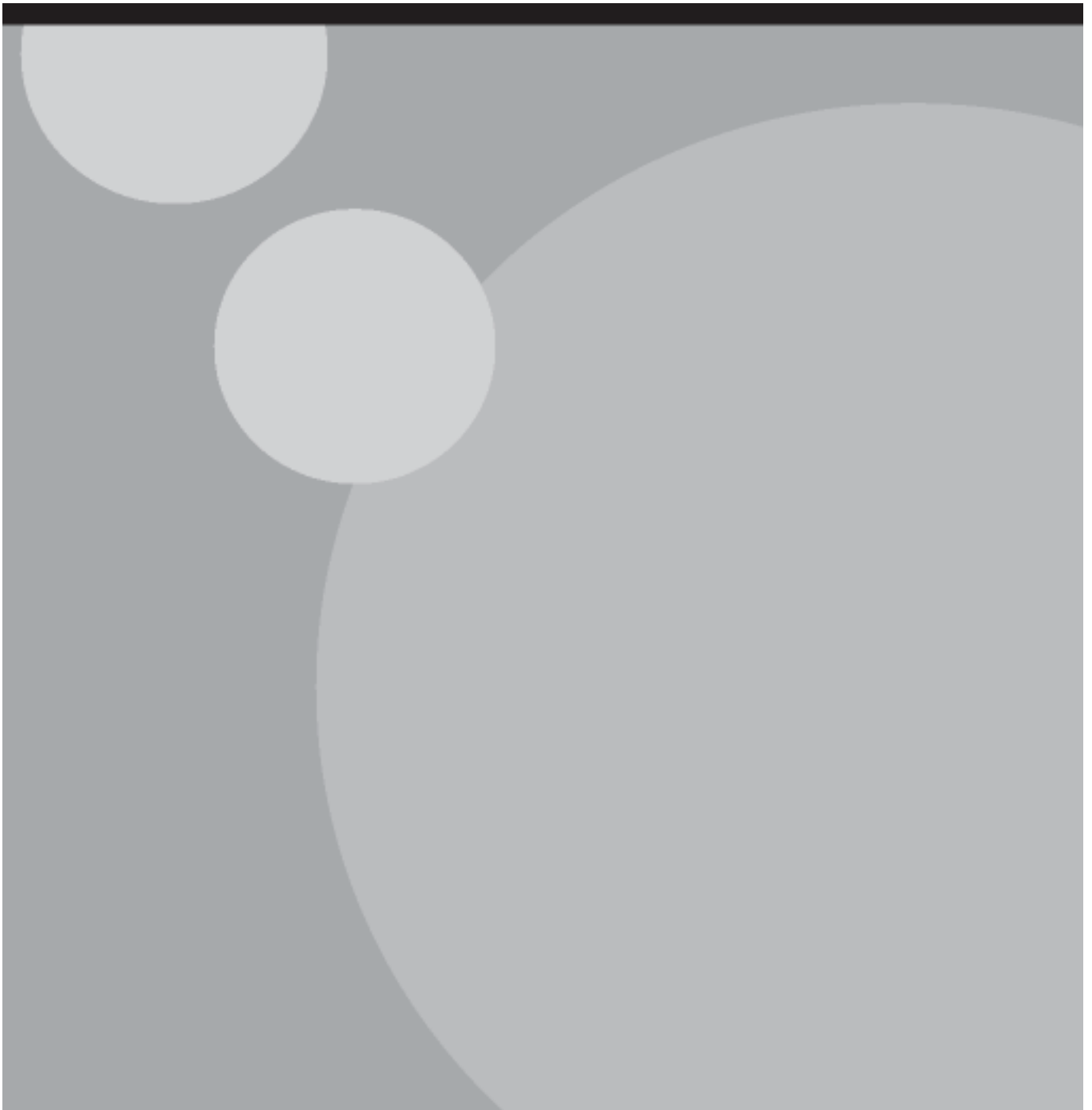




# DCLG'S second statement of new regulation (SNR2)

Measures coming into force between 1 July and 31 December 2011



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## Ministerial foreword

The Government wants to make the UK the best place in Europe to start, finance and grow a business by cutting the costs and burden of regulation. This lies at the heart of the Government's Plan for Growth. The Statement of New Regulation, combined with other measures that form part of this Government's strategy for reducing regulation, will reduce Whitehall's tendency to regulate and give businesses clarity about all new regulations being introduced.

I am pleased that our Statement of New Regulation shows that as a Department we are continuing to reduce burdens to businesses. We estimate that the measures we are introducing this year will lead to cost savings to businesses of £4.26m per annum.

We have already announced through the Localism Bill:

- Plans to remove the requirement for businesses to apply for small business rates relief
- Plans to widen the power to direct applications for major infrastructures project into the major infrastructure planning regime.

Our headline figures are encouraging but we still want to go further in reducing unnecessary burdens to business, including:

- Building Regulations Review 2013
- Reducing, where appropriate, the stock of regulations through the Red Tape Challenge, where we are leading on the housing, construction and planning theme.
