



2016 Commercial Victimisation Survey Administration and Support Sector



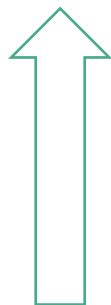
Key findings:

- Theft was the most common crime type and made up more than half of all crimes against this sector.
- Smaller businesses (1-9 employees) experienced more theft than larger businesses.
- Almost one fifth of businesses (18%) experienced crime in 2016.
- The incident rate for online crime was more than double the incident rate for 'traditional' crime.

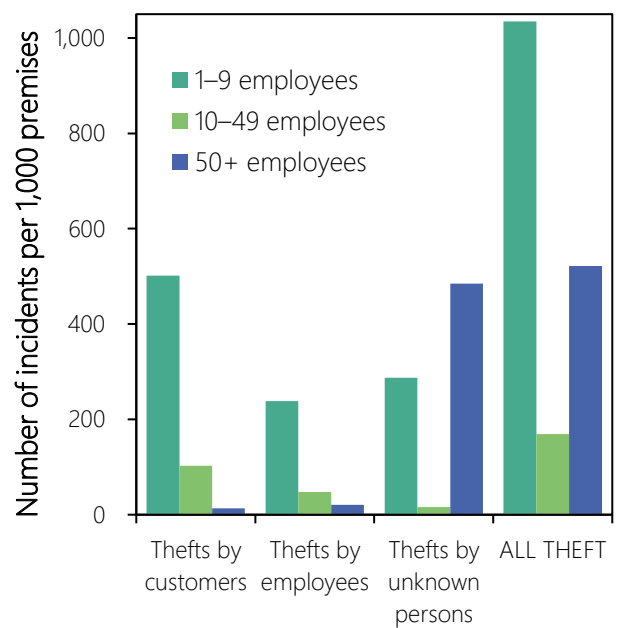
