Definitive Map Modification No. 598 Bridleway 11 Chappel and 64 Great
Tey and Restricted Byway 28 Chappel, (Colchester District) Order 2015

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. Following an earlier exchange of written representations, the Inspector appointed to determine the Order issued a letter in which he proposed to make modifications to the Order as drafted. Following advertisement of those proposals objections/representations have been received

The **start date** for the above Order is **13 June 2017**

Consideration of the Order will take the form of exchanges of statements of case and comments on statements of case which contain evidence in respect of the Inspector's proposed modifications only.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications will be to modify the Definitive Map for the area by:

- 1. Adding a length of Restricted Byway, to be known as Restricted Byway 28 Chappel, from the northern property boundary of High Garrett at Swanscomb Road, travelling along Ryeland Lane in an easterly then south easterly direction for a distance of approximately 430 metres where it meets Footpath 4 Chappel. The width of the way varies between 2.5-8 metres.
- 2. Upgrading a length of Footpath 4 Chappel, to be known as Restricted Byway 28 Chappel, from Oak Road, north of the Oaklands, travelling in a south westerly direction until meeting Footpath 26 where the path travels northerly along the western boundary of Priory House, then continues north for a distance of approximately 830 metres to meet the unaffected part of the Footpath 4. the width of the way varies between 3-9 metres.
- 3. Upgrading Footpath 11 Chappel, to be known as Bridleway 11 Chappel, travelling from Lamberts Lane down Sere Lane in an easterly then north easterly direction for a distance of approximately 710 metres where it meets Restricted Byway 28. The most westerly 285 metres is a moiety path which should also be recorded in the Parish of Great Tey. The width of the way varies between 2.5-8.5 metres.

The effect of the proposed modifications would be to:

• Delete all of the references to "Bridleway" and insert "Footpath".

- Delete the third description in Part 1 of the Order Schedule.
- Delete the eleventh to fifteenth lines in the second description in Part II of the Order Schedule and insert "the path is 1.5 metres in total".
- Delete the seventh to eleventh lines in the fourth description in Part II of the Order Schedule and insert "The width of the path is 1.5 metres in total".
- Delete the proposed bridleway from the Order Maps and amend the keys to the maps accordingly.

Within 14 weeks of the start date 19 September 2017

Everyone who has made an objection or representation following the proposed modification, the Authority, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who has written to us in respect of the Order must ensure their comments on any or every other statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the above date, the Secretary of State will send copies of the comments received to everyone else.

Any other person wishing to make representations in writing to the Secretary of State in respect of the above Order must do so in line with the timetable set out above.

In fairness to the other parties <u>everyone should keep to the timetable</u> to ensure that statements of case and comments are received on time.
