Travel Advice

Changes to driving licence validity across the UAE

New driving licences will now be issued for only 2 years and after that expatriates' licence renewal validity will be only five years and not 10 years as it has been. Expatiriates are also required to have a valid residence permit to renew their licence. Click <u>here</u> for details.

New traffic fines for the UAE

From the 1st July the cost of traffic fines across the UAE are changing and getting stricter – click <u>here</u> to be aware.

In advance of these rules however, Abu Dhabi residents who have gained points despite being generally good drivers will have their points wiped before the new regieme of fines is introduced. See more <u>here</u>.

Expatriates can now write and register their Wills in Abu Dhabi

New rules governing Wills in Abu Dhabi mean that non-Muslim expatriates can now dictate where they want their assets to go when they die and these Wills can be registered for approximately Dh500. See more <u>here</u>.

Abu Dhabi Taxi Fares Increased from June 1st

June the 1st marked the date for an increase in taxi fares for Abu Dhabi Residents. <u>Click</u> for more details. The daytime starting fare is now Dh5 (up from Dh3.5) and at night the starting fare is Dh5.50 (up from Dh4).

Improved maternity leave for Women in Dubai

A new Decree increases maternity leave for woman in Dubai and aims to promote a balance between career and family. Any permanent employee is now entitled to 90 days of maternity leave from the date of delivery. There are also regulations around Dubai Government entities establishing nurseries for employees' children in certain circumstances. Click <u>here</u> for more information.

Smart phones are the new passports at Terminal 3 in Dubai!
