

- Article 4 of Council Regulation (EC) 1/2005 requires that you provide for each journey the information indicated by an asterisk in the form overleaf if you are transporting any vertebrate animals **other than** Cattle, Sheep, Goats, Pigs and Unregistered Horses on journeys over 8 hours between EU Member States or between EU Member States and Third Countries.
- Farmers are exempted from carrying an Animal Transport Certificate when transporting their own animals in their own means of transport on journeys up to 50km (31.25 miles) from their holding, or as part of seasonal transhumance.
- This form is offered as an option. You may record the information in any other format (e.g. on a delivery note or an Animal Movement Licence).
- The other information it is suggested you provide completes the details of the journey and may help resolve any future queries. However it is voluntary and not required by Law.
- This form (or the required information if kept in another format) must be retained by transporters for six months after completion of the journey.
- The information at note 1 above must be made available to an inspector on demand who must be allowed to take a copy.
- Please Note: It is an offence to provide false information.
