Area South update

Built heritage updates: Heritage Agreements

- All Heritage Agreements sealed by Historic England and circulated to local authorities
- All LB Camden Heritage Agreements executed
- Heritage Agreements for 8 other local authorities have been sealed and returned to HS2.
- Next steps: HS2 Directors sign, HS2 legal team execute and return a copy to each party
- HAs from 9 local authorities outstanding

The tranche of priority sites are being progressed:


- Handsacre, Staffordshire

Late summer 2017

- Park Street Gardens, Birmingham

Handsacre, Staffordshire

- Geophysical survey has led to a targeted evaluation, overlying potential archaeological features or areas of high archaeological potential
- Trench 45 revealed possible post holes



Finham Brook, Warwickshire

- No archaeological deposits or features were discovered



Dalehouse Lane, Warwickshire

- No archaeological deposits or features were discovered



Phase One Forward Look


- Continuation of Urgent Works Packages
 - Critical locations such as habitat creation sites and early utilities.
 - Urgent Works Packages currently planned to run until end of July.
- Transition from EDP designing surveys to EWC.
 - This means your conversations will be with:
 - CSJV: ***- London
 - Fusion: ***– Bucks, Herts, Oxon, Northants and a bit of Warks
 - LM: ***– Warks, Birmingham, Solihull and Staffs.
 - *Sub-contractors of the above.*

Phase One Forward Look

- Start of 'HERDS' Work Packages
 - Follow-on from the Urgent Works Packages
 - Comprise the bulk of the historic environment surveys and investigations
 - Staged – scoping, surveys, investigations, post-ex
 - Each EWC will use multiple contractors to deliver the works in their Area.
- Notable upcoming surveys:
 - Trial-trenching in Park Street burial ground
 - Trial-trenching in St James's Gardens


Communications

- Recognise that communications between our contractors and yourselves have been confusing for the UWP.



Communications

- Reduced number of cooks for 'HERDS' packages will improve that scenario



Note, each area will use as many contractors as required to deliver the project within the framework above.

Phase One Communications

- Going forward:
 - Majority of the day-to-day relationship with stakeholders will be with the EWC (historic environment managers their sub-contractors (MoLA, COPA, Connect and others that come in as required))
 - Deliverables will all be on Sharepoint
 - Integrated Programme of historic environment investigation and recording works – on Sharepoint
 - Monthly HS2 catch-up with each stakeholder
 - ▶ Opportunity to feed back what is working well (or not) with the contractors.



Community Engagement

Community Engagement - Process

- Contractors identify engagement ideas in a 'Community Engagement Plan and set out how these be will be addressed as part of the Works in their historic environment Project Plans
- 'Sign off' of historic environment project plans/WSIs via Historic Environment Construction team in consultation with Community Engagement teams (CE).
- CE will check the 'Community Engagement Plan' for compliance with the HS2 CE strategy.
- HS2 and Contractor CE teams working together
- Direct working between HS2 CE teams and the Contractor Historic Environment specialist contractors.

What HS2 is doing

- Planning to share stories during existing annual opportunities to celebrate the historic environment throughout the year.
 - ▶ Themed national, regional and international days.
- Discuss with EWC ideas for engagement at the known high profile individual sites and route wide themes and objectives (Phase One).
 - ▶ Ensure that there are strategies in place for effective engagement on sites and areas with particular challenges/ requirements.
- Consider general engagement ideas and share with EWC.
 - ▶ Community receiving information e.g. walks, site open days, museum pop up, local display, website information.
 - ▶ Community contributing information – i.e. encourage community projects, fieldwork opportunities.


