GOVERNMENT RESPONSE TO FOUR REPORTS FROM THE ADVISORY COUNCIL ON THE MISUSE OF DRUGS

We are writing to provide you with the Government's response to four ACMD reports. We are very grateful to the ACMD for all the work they have undertaken in producing such comprehensive and high quality reports. We have considered the ACMD's advice in each of these reports carefully and have accepted the majority of the recommendations in the reports below, with the exception of drug consumption rooms:

Annex A: How can opioid substitution therapy (and drug treatment and recovery systems) be optimised to maximise recovery outcomes for service users?

Annex B: Reducing Opioid Related Deaths in the UK

Annex C: Diversion and Illicit Supply of Medicines

Annex D: Independent prescribing of controlled drugs by therapeutic radiographers

In each response we have set out in detail the range of work we are taking forward to address the recommendations.
