Or people who may feel different to some people about their gender or who they are attracted to.



What do words in this survey mean?



Here are what some words in this survey mean.

LGBT people	<p>In this survey we talk about LGBT people. When we say this it can mean people who are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lesbian• Gay• Bisexual• Transgender• And people who may feel something else about their gender or who they are attracted to. <p>There is more information about these things below.</p>
Bisexual (or Bi)	<p>This means people who are attracted to men and women.</p>
Gay	<p>This means men who are attracted to other men.</p> <p>Or women who are attracted to other women. Some women may say they are gay, not lesbian.</p>

<p>Gender</p>	<p>When someone is born they are usually told they are a boy or a girl.</p> <p>Your gender is about whether you feel you are a boy, a girl or something else.</p>
<p>Intersex</p>	<p>Intersex people have bodies that may be a bit different to what people think a boy or girl should be like.</p> <p>For example, their private parts may look a bit different to what people think a boy or girl should look like.</p> <p>People are usually told this by doctors when they are born or when they are young.</p>
<p>Lesbian</p>	<p>This means women who are attracted to other women.</p>
<p>Transgender (or trans)</p>	<p>Transgender people feel they are a different gender to the one they were given when they were born.</p> <p>For example, some people are told they are a boy. But they feel they are a girl. Or the other way around.</p>

<p>Trans woman or trans girl</p> <p>Trans man or trans boy</p> <p>Non-binary, Genderqueer, Agender Gender fluid</p>	<p>This is someone who was told they were a boy when they were born. But they feel they are a girl or a woman.</p> <p>This is someone who was told they were a girl when they were born. But they feel they are a boy or a man.</p> <p>Some people feel they are not a man or a woman.</p> <p>They may feel like they are both.</p> <p>Or they may feel they are something different.</p> <p>There are lots of words that people may use about themselves, like:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Non-binary • Genderqueer • Agender • Gender fluid
<p>Sexual Orientation</p> <p>Attracted to</p>	<p>Your sexual orientation is about who you may be attracted to or want a relationship with.</p> <p>Attracted to means you may fancy or want a relationship with a person.</p>
