Consideration of the Orders will take the form of exchanges of statements of case and comments on statements of case.

- 1) The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert that length of Public Footpath No.14 in the Parish of Bunbury commencing at O.S. grid reference SJ 5630 5754 and running in a generally south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 70 metres to O.S. grid reference SJ 5624 5750 then turning in a generally southerly direction for a distance of approximately 34 metres to O.S. grid reference SJ 5624 5747 and its junction with Public Footpath No.15 Bunbury. To a new line, in the Parish of Bunbury, commencing at O.S. grid reference SJ 5630 5754 and running in a generally west south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 15 metres to O.S. grid reference SJ 5629 5754 and then running in a generally south south easterly direction for approximately 31 metres to O.S. grid reference SJ 5630 5751 and then turning in a generally west south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 50 metres to O.S. grid reference SJ 5625 5749 and then running in a generally south south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 27 metres to O.S. grid reference SJ 5624 5747 and its junction with Public Footpath No.15 Bunbury.
- **2)**The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to extinguish that length of Unrecorded Footpath on land off Oak Gardens in the Parish of Bunbury commencing at its junction with public footpath no. 14 Bunbury at O.S. grid reference SJ 5629 5753 and running in a generally west south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 164 metres to O.S. grid reference SJ 5614 5746 and its junction with public footpath no.15 Bunbury.

Within 8 weeks of the start date [by 22 March 2018]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation or any other written representation must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send full copies to the Authority. Copies (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) will also be sent to the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Orders.

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 3 May 2018]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation, the Authority, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who has written to us in respect of the Orders must ensure that their comments on any or every other statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of these comments to everyone else.



Public Footpath No.14, Bunbury

That length of Public Footpath No. 14 in the Parish of Bunbury commencing at O.S. grid reference SJ 5630 5754 (point A on Plan No. TCPA/031A) and running in a generally south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 70 metres to O.S. grid reference SJ 5624 5750 (point B on Plan No. TCPA/031A) then turning in a generally southerly direction for a distance of approximately 34 metres to O.S. grid reference SJ 5624 5747 (point C on Plan No. TCPA/031A) and its junction with Public Footpath No.15 Bunbury as indicated by a solid black line between the points marked A-B-C on Plan No. TCPA/031A. A total distance of approximately 104 metres in length.

PART 2 Description of site of new Path or Way

Public Footpath No.14, Bunbury

A footpath, in the Parish of Bunbury, to be known as part of Footpath no. 14, commencing at O.S. grid reference SJ 5630 5754 (point A on Plan No. TCPA/031A) and running in a generally west south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 15 metres to O.S. grid reference SJ 5629 5754 (point D on Plan No. TCPA/031A) and then running in a generally south south easterly direction for approximately 31 metres to O.S. grid reference SJ 5630 5751 (point E on Plan No. TCPA/031A) and then turning in a generally west south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 50 metres to O.S. grid reference SJ 5625 5749 (point F on Plan No. TCPA/031A) and then running in a generally south south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 27 metres to O.S. grid reference SJ 5624 5747 (point C on Plan No. TCPA/031A) and its junction with Public Footpath No.15 Bunbury as indicated by a bold dashed line between the points A-D-E-F-C on Plan No. TCPA/031A.

A total distance of approximately 123 metres in length.

The footpath will be 2 metres wide between points A-D.

The footpath will be 2.5 metres wide between points D-E-F-C.
