

NOTICE OF ORDER

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

Great Hinton Path No. 34 Rights of Way Modification Order 2016

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. Following an earlier exchange of written representations, the Inspector appointed to determine the Order issued a letter in which she proposed to make modifications to the Order as drafted. Following advertisement of those proposals one objection has been received.

The **start date** for the above Order is **17 January 2018**.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of exchanges of statements of case and comments on statements of case which contain evidence in respect of the modified part of the Order and evidence in respect of the unmodified part of the Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications will be to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by recording the width of Great Hinton Path No. 34, Bleet Lane (leading from Cold Harbour to the Haghill to Steeple Ashton Road) as 6.1 metres (20 feet) for its length (approx. 302 metres).

The effect of the proposed modifications would be to modify the Order by providing for the following:

- Within Parts 1 and 2 of the Schedule:
- after text "...*Width...*" replace text "*6.1 metres (20 feet)*" with text "*...shown by red hatching taken from the Second Edition 1885 survey, 1899 revision, 1901 publication Ordnance Survey map*";
- Attach the map outlined above to the Order.

Timetable for sending in statements of case and comments

Within 8 weeks of the start date [by 14 March 2018]

The Order Making Authority, the applicant and everyone who has made an objection or representation following the proposed modifications or any other written representation must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after receiving it the Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation following the proposed modifications, the applicant and any other person who has previously written to us in respect of the Order.

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 25 April 2018]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation following the proposed modifications, the Authority, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who has written to us in respect of the Order must ensure their comments on any or every other statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the above date, the Secretary of State will send copies of the comments received to everyone else.

Any other person wishing to make representations in writing to the Secretary of State in respect of the above Order must do so in line with the timetable set out above.

In fairness to the other parties everyone should keep to the timetable to ensure that statements of case and comments are received on time.

All parties must keep to the timetable set out above and ensure that statements of case are received by the Secretary of State on time. Late documents will be returned.
