

NOTICE OF ORDER WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981 SECTION 53

Northumberland County Council
Definitive Map Modification Order (No 21) 2016 Byways Open to All Traffic
Nos 42, 29 & 30 (Parishes of Beadnell & Ellingham)

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is **13 March 2018**.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of exchanges of statements of case and comments on statements of case.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by:-

Former Berwick-upon-Tweed Borough

Byway Open to All Traffic No 29 (Parish of Ellingham)

Adding thereto a byway open to all traffic, from a point marked U, on the C69 road, immediately west of Tewart Arms Cottage, in a general north-westerly direction along the U2052 road, for a distance of 340 metres, to a point marked Y, on alleged Byway Open to All Traffic No 42 in the Parish of Beadnell, 345 metres north of Chathill Station.

Byway Open to All Traffic No 42 (Parish of Beadnell)

Adding thereto a byway open to all traffic, from a point marked Y, on alleged Byway Open to All Traffic No 29 in the Parish of Ellingham, 345 metres north of Chathill Station, in a north-westerly direction along the U2052 road, for a distance of 450 metres, to a point marked X, on alleged Byway Open to All Traffic No 30 in the Parish of Ellingham, 20 metres south-east of where the U2052 road crosses the Long Nanny.

Byway Open to All Traffic No 30 (Parish of Ellingham)

Adding thereto a byway open to all traffic, from a point marked X, on alleged Byway Open to All Traffic No 42, in the Parish of Beadnell, 20 metres south-east of the point where the U2052 road crosses the Long Nanny, in a north-westerly then northerly direction along the U2052 road, for a distance of 435 metres, to a point marked T, on the U2025 road, 640 metres east of Newham.

Timetable for sending in statements of case and comments

Within 2 weeks of the start date [by 27 March 2018]

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within 8 weeks of the start date [by 8 May 2018]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation or any other written representation must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send full copies to the Authority. Copies (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) will also be sent to the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 19 June 2018]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation, the Authority, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who has written to us in respect of the Order must ensure that their comments on any or every other statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of these comments to everyone else.

Any other person wishing to make representations in writing to the Secretary of State in respect of the above Order must do so in line with the timetable set out above.

In fairness to the other parties everyone should keep to the timetable to ensure that statements of case and comments are received on time. Late documents will be returned.

Definitive Map Modification Order (No 21) 2016

Byways Open to All Traffic Nos 42, 29 & 30 (Parishes of Beadnell & Ellingham)

This Order is made by Northumberland County Council under Section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the Act") because it appears to that authority that the Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for the County of Northumberland require modification in consequence of the occurrence of events specified in Section 53(3)(c)(i) and (iii), namely, the discovery by the authority of evidence which (when considered with all other relevant evidence available to them) shows that a right of way which is not shown in the map and statement subsists or is reasonably alleged to subsist over land in the area to which the map relates, being a right of way such that the land over which the right subsists is a public path, a restricted byway or, subject to section 54A, a byway open to all traffic; and that there is no public right of way over land shown in the map and statement as a highway of any description, or any other particulars contained in the map and statement require modification.

The authority has consulted every local authority whose area includes the land to which the order relates. The Northumberland County Council hereby order that:

1. For the purposes of this Order the relevant date is 1 July 2016.
2. The Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for the County of Northumberland shall be modified as described in the Schedule and shown on the map attached to the Order.
3. This Order shall take effect on the date it is confirmed and may be cited as The Northumberland County Council Definitive Map Modification Order (No 21) 2016.

Description of Modification to Definitive Map and Statement

Former Berwick-upon-Tweed Borough

Beadnell **Footpath No 20** **(NU 12 NE)**

Part I Map: The map is not affected.

Part II Statement: To be amended as follows:
From Byway Open to All Traffic No 29 in the Parish of Ellingham, north-east of Chathill, in a northerly and north-easterly direction to the Fleetham - Chathill road, continuing in a north-westerly direction to join Footpath No 18 in the Parish of Ellingham, at the footbridge over Long Nanny.

Beadnell **Byway Open to All Traffic No 42** **(NU 12 NE)**

Part I Map: Adding thereto a byway open to all traffic, from a point marked Y, on alleged Byway Open to All Traffic No 29 in the Parish of Ellingham, 345 metres north of Chathill Station, in a north-westerly direction along the U2052 road, for a distance of 450 metres, to a point marked X, on alleged Byway Open to All Traffic No 30 in the Parish of Ellingham, 20 metres south-east of where the U2052 road crosses the Long Nanny.

Part II Statement: To be prepared as follows:
As a 10 metre wide byway open to all traffic, from Byway Open to All Traffic No 29 in the Parish of Ellingham, 345 metres north of Chathill Station, in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 200 metres to the disused railway line crossing, thereafter as a 7 to 8 metre wide byway, continuing in a north-westerly direction for a further 250 metres to join Byway Open to All Traffic No 30 in the Parish of Ellingham, 20 metres south-east of where the U2052 road crosses the Long Nanny (stream).

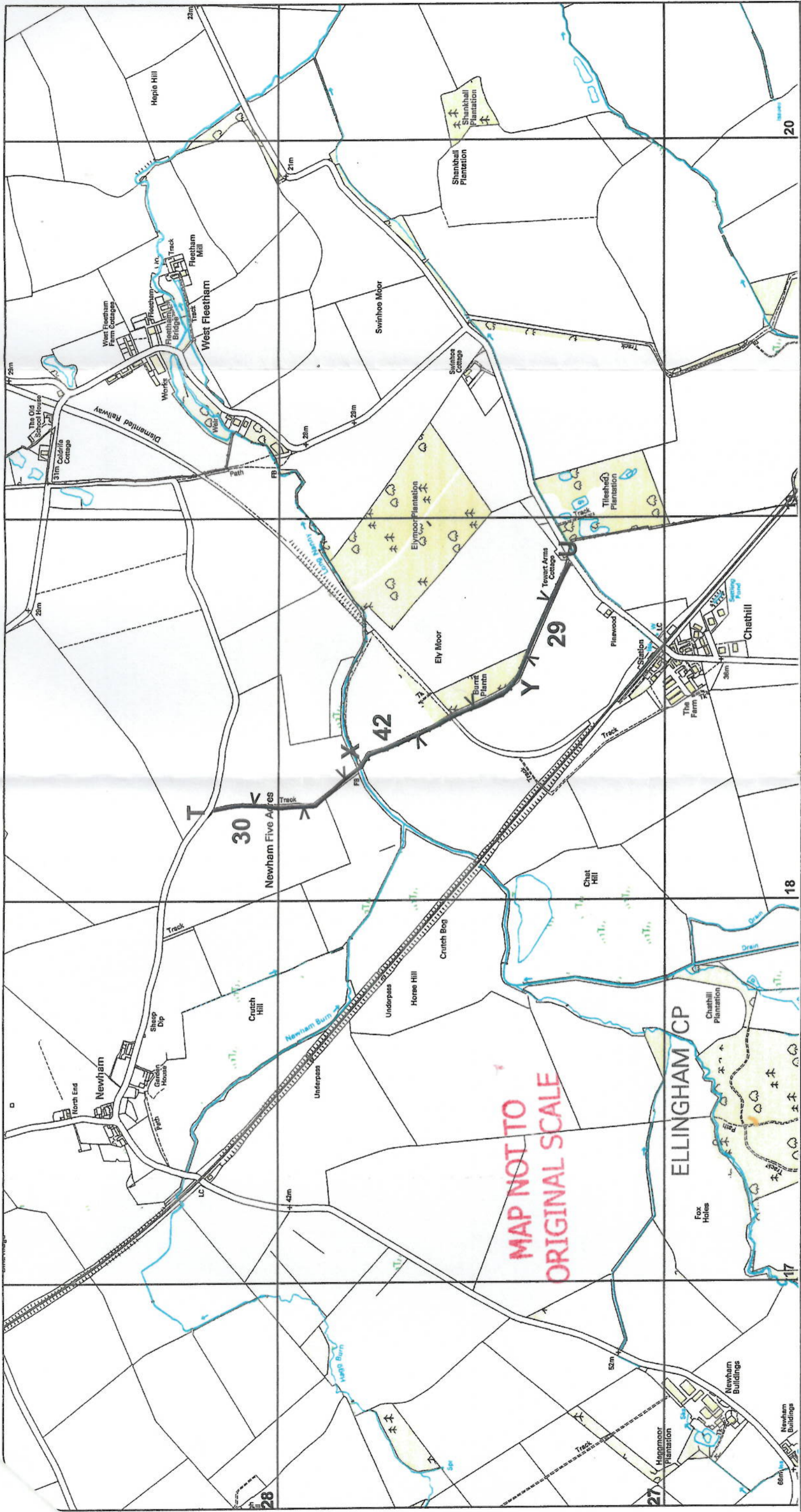
Part I Map: Adding thereto a byway open to all traffic, from a point marked U, on the C69 road, immediately west of Tewart Arms Cottage, in a general north-westerly direction along the U2052 road, for a distance of 340 metres, to a point marked Y, on alleged Byway Open to All Traffic No 42 in the Parish of Beadnell, 345 metres north of Chathill Station.

Part II Statement: To be prepared as follows:
As a 10 metre wide byway open to all traffic, from the C69 road, immediately west of Tewart Arms Cottage, in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 340 metres to join Byway Open to All Traffic No 42 in the Parish of Beadnell, 345 metres north of Chathill Station.

Ellingham**Byway Open to All Traffic No 30****(NU 12 NE)**

Part I Map: Adding thereto a byway open to all traffic, from a point marked X, on alleged Byway Open to All Traffic No 42, in the Parish of Beadnell, 20 metres south-east of the point where the U2052 road crosses the Long Nanny, in a north-westerly then northerly direction along the U2052 road, for a distance of 435 metres, to a point marked T, on the U2025 road, 640 metres east of Newham.

Part II Statement: To be prepared as follows:
As a 7 to 8 metre wide byway open to all traffic, from Byway Open to All Traffic No 42 in the Parish of Beadnell, 20 metres south-east of the point where the U2052 road crosses the Long Nanny, in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 20 metres to the Long Nanny (stream). Within the highway, there is a 15 metre long, 1.25 metre wide footbridge across this stream. A 7 to 8 metre wide byway then continues in a north-westerly direction for a further 110 metres. Thereafter as an 8 metre wide byway, continuing in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 40 metres, then in a northerly direction for a distance of 265 metres to join the U2025 road, 640 metres east of Newham.




