Where to send your completed form

Payments made directly between the parties

If your maintenance order was made in England or Wales, the debtor lives in England or Wales and payments are instead made directly between the parties, you should apply to your nearest designated Family Court. You will need to select the issue category '**Children: child contact issues and disputes over maintenance payments**' to find your nearest designated Family Court.

Payments made through the court

If your maintenance order was made in England or Wales, the debtor lives in England or Wales and payments are made through the court, you should apply to a Maintenance Enforcement Business Centre based on where the debtor now lives.
