

Preliminary flood risk assessment: London Borough of Brent

This addendum by London Borough of Brent (2017) updates the council's preliminary flood risk assessment report published in 2011. Read the addendum in conjunction with the [preliminary assessment report](#).

Addendum

The preliminary flood risk assessment (PFRA) and flood risk areas (FRAs) for London Borough of Brent were reviewed during 2017, using all relevant current flood risk data and information.

Past flood risk

There has been very few flooding incidents in the London Borough of Brent. Most of the flooding is due to inadequate capacity in Brent North Catchment and at present a Drainage Study is in progress to identify the problems and locations.

There were few incidents of flooding in the carriageway, but this was mainly due to blocked gullies and problems has been resolved.

There were no reports of flooding from main sewers or ordinary watercourses.

Future flood risk

The Council will continue to monitor and investigate the flooding incidents. We have a robust regime for inspection and routine cleaning of road gullies, highway drainage and watercourses.

We will investigate all flooding incidents and they will be recorded on our flooding database. We will continue to work closely with Environment Agency, Thames Water and other flood risk management authorities.

Flood risk areas (FRAs)

The following FRA have been identified for the purposes of the Flood Risk Regulations (2009) 2nd planning cycle:

- Greater London.

Other changes

We will update our flood maps when the Drainage Study for Brent North and Harrow is completed. We have also commenced review of our Strategic Flood Risk Assessment and that will be completed by 22 December 2017.
