

Preliminary flood risk assessment: London Borough of Haringey

This addendum by London Borough of Haringey (2017) updates the council's preliminary flood risk assessment report published in 2011. Read the addendum in conjunction with the [preliminary assessment report](#).

Addendum

The preliminary flood risk assessment (PFRA) and flood risk areas (FRAs) for London Borough of Haringey were reviewed during 2017, using all relevant current flood risk data and information.

There are currently no changes to the assessment of risk.

Past flood risk

Haringey Council are working to improve inter-departmental communication and that of relevant stakeholders to ensure flood evidence is gathered and shared.

Future flood risk

Catchment Based approach to flood risk study in progress.

Increased understanding of sewer system, pumping stations, attenuation tanking, capacity issues, flow paths. Improved analysis of fluvial risk.

Analysis of Environment Agency climate change increase assessment specific to Haringey. Sensitivity testing requested where deemed necessary at the upper Environment Agency advised threshold level.

Publication of Haringey's Local Flood Risk Management Strategy provides a strategic approach as to how flood risk will be managed.

Flood risk areas (FRAs)

The following FRA has been identified for the purposes of the Flood Risk Regulations (2009) second planning cycle:

- Greater London (part of the London Borough of Haringey area is within this FRA)
