

Preliminary flood risk assessment: London Borough of Tower Hamlets

This addendum by London Borough of Tower Hamlets (2017) updates the council's preliminary flood risk assessment report published in 2011. Read the addendum in conjunction with the [preliminary assessment report](#).

Addendum

The preliminary flood risk assessment (PFRA) and flood risk areas (FRAs) for the London Borough of Tower Hamlets were reviewed during 2017, using all relevant current flood risk data and information.

Past flood risk

There have not been any significant flooding incidents recorded by the London Borough of Tower Hamlets since 2011. For this reason there is no change in the borough's understanding of significant flooding from historic flooding events.

Future flood risk

Improved surface water flood risk modelling projects, which incorporates the Thames Water local sewer network, have improved the London Borough of Tower Hamlet's understanding of how the potential consequences of future floods and the impact of climate change could impact on local flood risk in the borough.
