Annex 8 The New CS Offers for Wildlife

Introduction

Four New CS Offers for Wildlife are available to help farmers improve the wildlife on their farm, providing year round habitats and helping pollinators to thrive. The Offers have been designed to help farmers choose the right options for their land and make it quicker and easier to apply for a Mid Tier agreement. They are the:

- Arable Offer
- Lowland Grazing Offer
- Mixed Farming Offer
- Upland Offer

These Offers have been designed to deliver a sufficient level of environmental benefits so that scoring is not required. This means that, provided the applicant meets the minimum criteria, an agreement offer will be made.

The Arable Offer can be applied for through an online application or a paper application. The online application process will be quicker and easier to complete and is part of our plans to make CS a more simplified scheme.

Organic Farms: Provided they have eligible parcels, organic farmers can apply for any of the 4 New CS Offers. However it is strongly recommended that they apply through the standard Mid Tier route so they can make use of the full range of options suitable for organic farms.

For the 3 lowland Offers, applicants must be prepared to manage at least 3% of their farmed land, so 3ha in every 100 ha, using key land management options. There is no requirement to enter a minimum area of land into an Offer, as long as the land can accommodate the options chosen. Businesses are restricted to one New CS Offers for Wildlife application per Single Business Identifier (SBI) per year.

In all cases options applied for as part of the 4 New CS Offers for Wildlife cannot overlap with Ecological Focus Area (EFA) land.

As part of the 2018 pilot application round, the following SBIs are <u>not eligible</u> to apply for the New CS Offers for Wildlife, and potential applicants are advised to apply for Countryside Stewardship via Mid Tier or Higher Tier agreement:

- SBIs which contain Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSIs) or Scheduled Monuments (SMs);
- SBIs with an Environmental Stewardship agreement that is not due to expire before 1 January 2019; or
- SBIs subject to an Inheritance Tax Exemption agreement with HMRC

Note: As part of the 2018 pilot application round SBIs with more than 100 parcels will not be able to apply for the Arable Offer online. Potential applicants are advised to request a paper application form instead.

Mid Tier, Higher Tier or capital grants may be more appropriate for applicants who wish to:

- manage organic land;
- manage historic features or specialist habitats such as wetlands and orchards;
- address water quality issues in priority catchments; and
- apply for capital grants, such as woodland creation, hedgerow and boundaries grant, or for yard works to reduce water pollution.

The following tables detail the specific options and eligibility criteria under each of the Offers:

The Arable Offer: (applicants choose a minimum of 3 options from a total of 11)

- The applicant's land must be registered on the Rural Payments service to the SBI submitting the application. Land use for the year of application must be recorded as arable or temporary grassland. Permanent grassland can be included but only hedgerow options can be located on those fields. The 11 options are divided into 3 categories in the table below. Applicants must pick at least one option from each category.
- The minimum number of options in the 5 year agreement is therefore 3. Applicants can select as many options as they wish, but must enter a minimum of 3% of their land into the Offer.

Category 1. Nectar and pollen sources for insect pollinators and insect-rich foraging for birds (select at least one, minimum 1% or 1 ha per 100 ha of farmed land included in the agreement, no maximum)

The Lowland Grazing Offer: (applicants choose a minimum of 2 options from a total of 7)

- The applicant's land must be registered on the Rural Payments service to the SBI submitting the application. Land use for the year of application must be recorded as permanent grassland. Arable fields can be included but only hedgerow options can be located on those fields.
- The 7 options are divided into 3 categories in the table below. Applicants must pick at least one option from category 1 and 2, and may choose additional options from category 3 if they wish.
- The minimum number of options in the 5 year agreement is therefore 2. Applicants can select as many options as they wish, but must enter a minimum of 3% of their land into the Offer.

Category 1. Nectar and pollen sources for insect pollinators and insect-rich foraging for birds (select at least one, minimum 2% or 2 ha per 100 ha of farmed land included in the agreement, no maximum)

Category 2. Nesting and shelter for insect pollinators and birds (applicants MUST select this option, minimum 500m of BE3 / 1% or 1 ha of GS1 per 100 ha farmed land included in the agreement, no maximum)

Category 3. Optional additional resources & habitats (no minimum or maximum, apart from individual option requirements)

The Mixed Farming Offer:

(applicants choose a minimum of 3 options from a total of 14)

- The applicant's land must be registered on the Rural Payments service to the SBI submitting the application. Land use for the year of application must be recorded as arable or grassland.
- The 14 options are divided into 3 categories in the table below. Applicants must pick at least one option from each category.
- The minimum number of options in the 5 year agreement is therefore 3. Applicants can select as many options as they wish, but must enter a minimum of 3% of their land into the Offer.

Category 1. Nectar and pollen sources for insect pollinators and insect-rich foraging for birds (select at least one, minimum 1% or 1 ha per 100 ha of farmed land included in the agreement for AB1 and AB8; 2% or 2ha per 100 ha for GS4. No maximum)

The Upland Offer: (applicants choose from a total of 8 options / supplements)

- The applicant's land must be registered on the Rural Payments service to the SBI submitting the application. Land use for the year of application must be recorded as permanent grassland.
- All land in the application must be within the Severely Disadvantaged Area (SDA) (applicants who wish to include land outside the SDA will need to apply for a Mid Tier agreement).
- There are 4 options and 4 supplements to choose from. As a minimum, farmers can pick 1 base option and two supplements or two base options and one supplement or three base options.
- The supplements can only be used with the relevant base option. see table below
- The minimum number of options/supplements in the 5 year agreement is therefore 3. Applicants can select as many options as they wish.

Key Information:

Applicants who want to access a wider range of multi-year options or capital works will need to apply for Mid Tier, Higher Tier or capital grants schemes.

All the Terms & Conditions, rules and scheme requirements detailed in the Mid Tier Manual apply to the New CS Offers for Wildlife applicants and Agreement Holders. However, there are a number of distinct differences that apply. These are detailed below and in the relevant sections of this manual.

- if the applicant meets the eligibility requirements of the Offer they will secure a Mid Tier agreement. Scoring does not apply to the New CS Offers for Wildlife;
- capital works are not available as part of the New CS Offers for Wildlife;
- an Historic Environment Farm Environment Record (HEFER) is not required as part of the application, but a Farm Environment Record (FER) is required; and
- options applied for as part of the New CS Offers for Wildlife cannot overlap with Ecological Focus Area (EFA) land.

The application process

The Arable Offer is available via online applications from your Rural Payments account.

For those unable to apply for the Arable Offer on-line, a pre-populated paper application form can be requested from Natural England.

Applying for the other 3 New CS Offers for Wildlife is via a simplified paper application process.

- Lowland Grazing Offer
- Upland Offer
- Mixed Farming Offer
