- which are free of Brucellosis in accordance with the Chapter on porcine brucellosis of the Terrestrial Animal Health Code of the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE)
- in which no animal vaccinated against Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) has been present in the preceding 12 months
- in which no clinical, serological, virological or pathological evidence of Aujeszky's disease has been detected in the preceding 12 months
- which are not situated in a restricted area defined under the provisions of European Union (EU) legislation due to the emergence of an infectious or contagious disease in domestic pigs, including FMD, Swine Vesicular disease, Vesicular Stomatitis, Classical Swine Fever and African Swine Fever
- and have not been kept previously in any herd of a lower status than described above
