Will you help us with our inspection?

Information for children, young people and families

This leaflet tells you what the inspection is all about.

It also tells you why inspectors want to hear your views and the sort of things they may ask you.

Who are Ofsted?

We are a team of inspectors looking at how children and young people are helped, protected and looked after in the area where you live.

Why are inspectors visiting?

Inspectors want to see what is working well and what could work better for children who need help and protection, and children who are looked after by the local authority.

Why have I been asked to take part?

We want to see how good adults are at helping you. We look at files and talk to adults, but we also want to know what you think of the help you have been given.

What will I be asked to do?

Inspectors may:

- sit in on a meeting with you to see how well adults work together to help children, young people and their families
- talk with you about what you think they want to hear how you are being helped to keep safe, and how you are being looked after and supported; they may ask to meet you in person or phone you
- meet some young people who live in a children's home a long way from the local authority, to ask you how well you are supported.

Inspectors are there to see how you are helped – they not there to check on you.

You do not have to share personal information with them.
