Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Orders have been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Orders.

The start date for the above Orders is 09 October 2018.

Consideration of the Orders will take the form of a public local inquiry.

The Inquiry will be held at **Hurst Green Village Hall, Station Road, Hurst Green, East Sussex TN19 7PL** on **Tuesday 02 April 2019** at **10.00am**.

The effect of the Orders, if confirmed without modifications, will be to:1) Modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by recording the position and width of the existing Public Footpath Hurst Green 23 between TO 73006 28510 and TO 73060 28589.

The width of the footpath is to be recorded as between 3.0 and 3.3 metres. The position of the path is to be recorded as shown on the plan accompanying the Order (Plan HGN/FP23/DMMO/2017 V1). &

2) Divert part of public footpath Hurst Green 23 for approximately 95 metres in a generally north-easterly direction from TQ 73006 28509 to TQ 73060 28589 as shown on the plan accompanying the Order as a solid black line between points A-B-C; to a new line commencing immediately adjacent to the start of the current path at the A21 London Road at TQ 73005 28512 where it will run for approximately 5.5 metres in a north-westerly direction parallel to the road before turning north-east at TQ 73001 28515 to run parallel to the current path following a garden boundary for approximately 92 metres to TQ 73055 28890. The new path will turn and run for approximately 6 metres to re-join the existing path at TQ 73060 28589. As shown on the plan accompanying the Order as a dashed black line between points D-E-F-G-C and will comprise a width of 2.5 metres.

As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send full copies to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Orders (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Orders (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).



The existing public footpath Hurst Green 23 through the property 'Jesse's' running in a generally north-easterly direction from TQ 73006 28510 (point A on the Order plan) to TQ 73060 28589 (point D) shown on the Order plan by a dashed black line.

From the vehicle gate at London Road (A21) at point A the footpath is recorded as following the driveway of the property, with its northerly extent defined by the driveway edge between points A-B-C and then on a straight alignment between point C and the field gate at point D.



This Order is also made under section 53A(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the 1981 Act") because it appears to the authority that the East Sussex (Rother District) definitive map and statement require modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in section 53(3)(a)(i) of the 1981 Act, namely, the diversion (as authorised by this Order) of a highway shown or required to be shown in the map and statement.


The applicant has agreed to defray any compensation which becomes payable in consequence of the coming into force of this order and expenses which are incurred in bringing the new site of the path into a fit condition for use by the public.

Rother District Council and Hurst Green Parish Council have been consulted as required by Section 120(2) of the 1980 Act.

BY THIS ORDER:

- 1. The public right of way over the land situated in the parish of Hurst Green and shown by a solid black line on the map attached to this Order and described in part 1 of the Schedule to this Order shall be stopped up on the date on which East Sussex County Council, as highway authority, certifies that work to bring the route of the new highway described in part 2 of the Schedule to this Order into a fit condition for use by the public has been completed, and thereupon the East Sussex (Rother District) definitive map shall be modified by deleting from it that public right of way.
- 2. There shall at the end of 28 days from the date of confirmation of this Order be a public footpath over the land situated in the parish of Hurst Green described in part 2 of the Schedule and shown by a broken black line on the map contained in this Order and thereupon the East Sussex (Rother District) definitive map shall be modified by adding that path to it.


DESCRIPTION OF NEW PATH OR WAY
