Our modern Industrial Strategy sets out our long-term plan to boost productivity by backing business to create high quality, well-paid jobs throughout the United Kingdom with investment in skills, industries and infrastructure.

In London a partnership of business and civic leaders – alongside other local partners – is working with the government to build on existing strengths, help business to flourish, and grow skills and opportunities for workers across the area.

Industrial Strategy highlights include:

E10m to support the development of the Cell & Gene Therapy Manufacturing Centre in Guy's Hospital, which will help translate early stage research into commercially viable and investable therapies.

£8.5m to provide residents with the digital connectivity they need through improvements in the availability of full fibre broadband.

£9.8m to accelerate housebuilding by providing the vital infrastructure needed to access new and existing sites.

 4,619,700 people in employment, an increase of 829,100 since 2010. 173,700 workers directly benefiting from the National Living and Minimum Wages. 44,410 apprenticeships starts last year.
