Provisional November 2018 exam entries: GCSEs


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This report presents provisional figures on the number of entries for GCSEs submitted by schools and colleges in England to exam boards by 24 October 2018 for the exams being sat in November 2018. The November 2018 series is restricted to students who were aged at least 16 by the end of the preceding August. All the November 2018 entries are students sitting either GCSE English language and/or GCSE mathematics.


November GCSE entries over time

Overall, GCSE entries in November 2018 increased by 55%, from 67,755 in 2017 to 104,710.

Variations in entries over recent years may reflect changes in re-sit requirements related to funding, the transition from legacy to reformed qualifications, and availability of assessments.



GCSE mathematics entries by tier




There were 55,125 entries to GCSE mathematics in November 2018.

In 2018, the majority (93%) of entries were for the foundation tier paper and the remaining (7%) entered for the higher tier paper.


November GCSE entries by subject

Entries in mathematics are 55,125, a 58% increase on 2017, but more similar to 2016.

Entries in English language also saw an increase to 49,585, representing a 50% increase on 2017, continuing a trend of increase over the past 5 years.



GCSE entries by year group



Entries in November are from year 12 and above. Since 2017, year 11 students are no longer allowed to enter the November examination series.

Year 12 entries increased by 33% from 43,480 in 2017 to 57,650 in 2018.

Provisional November entries

In this release, Ofqual presents data on the number of provisional entries for GCSEs in England received by exam boards for the November 2018 exam series. The entries that schools and colleges can make with exam boards to sit exams in

The entries that schools and colleges can make with exam boards to sit exams in November is restricted to post 16 students. The figures for entries can change daily up to the day of the exams. We collect provisional data at the point when it is reasonably complete, although final entry numbers may be slightly different from these. The figures presented here are the provisional figures as submitted by schools and colleges to exam boards by 24 October 2018.

In England, GCSE English language and GCSE mathematics exams are available in November, but only for students who were aged 16 or above on 31 August of that year.

In this release, all figures are rounded to the nearest 5 to ensure confidentiality of data. Further information on this release is available in the <u>background information</u> as well as <u>data tables</u> accompanying this report.

November entries have varied in the last few years which likely reflects a combination of factors including the transition from legacy to reformed qualifications, resit requirements, and the availability of assessments (e.g. this November being the first when candidates also sat a 9 to 1 GCSE in the summer).

In November 2018, much of the overall rise in mathematics is due to the increase in students in Year 13 and above. This reverses the drop in this age category seen last year. The change in entry pattern in 2017 reflected the need for Year 13 candidates who had not previously taken the new 9 to 1 qualification in mathematics (with substantive changes to taught content compared to the legacy A* to G qualification) to complete a full year of study before re-entering to take these new qualifications.

GCSE mathematics is a tiered qualification, further details have been provided about the entries for the higher and foundation tiers in this release. Most entries for GCSE mathematics in November 2018 were for the foundation tier paper. This suggests that the majority of entries have been made by learners who are re-sitting the foundation tier so that they may continue studying and be funded post 16.



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
