FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000. MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE: ANIMALS EUTHANIZED

I refer to your e-mail of 8 October 2018, which was acknowledged on the 10 October 2018.

We are treating your e-mail as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your e-mail you requested the following information:

"Please could you provide me with the data for how many animals have been euthanized by your force since 2016, please could you also specify the type of animal and the reason."

A search for information has now been completed by the Ministry of Defence Police(MDP) and I can confirm that we do hold information in scope of your request.

The only animals used by the Ministry of Defence Police (MDP) are dogs. The dogs used by the MDP are provided by the Defence Animal Training Regiment (DATR) and are trained to national police standards. At the end of their working lives our dogs are returned to the DATR who make every endeavour to rehome. Any decision to euthanize a dog used by the MDP is therefore made by the DATR who have provided the following information:

- 10 dogs have been euthanized since January 2016 due to vetinary conditions that were causing unnecessary suffering.
- 5 dogs have been euthanized since Januray 2016 as they were assessed as presenting an unacceptable risk to public safety.
