## **Notes**

- It is necessary to read the Commission Regulation 1739/2005 Question and Answer sheet before completing this application form. - The species covered by the Regulation are all mammals (including bats), birds, bees, salmon and trout.
- Registration under this Regulation is only necessary where circuses or animal acts intend to travel to other EU Member States.
- The Regulation applies to 'circus animal acts' and to other 'animal acts' kept for the primary purpose of public exhibition or entertainment. Animals that fall within this definition need to comply with the requirements of the Regulation. Conversely, animals kept primarily for another purpose, such as pet, farm animal or zoo animal would be excluded because they would fall within other regimes that regulate movements within the EU.
- This form requires you to provide information for the issue of passports for circus/animal act animals. Please note that this excludes dogs, cats, ferrets and horses who are required to have passports under other legislation. No animal is required to have more than one passport or health certificate but if dogs, cats, ferrets or horses are of the circus or act, they will still need to conform with the requirements of Commission Regulation No. 1739/2005.
- Your application for registration must be received at least 40 working days prior to travel.
- Please return your fully completed application form to the address at the head of this form.
- APHA will make charges for the registration of your circus or animal act and will also charge for the passport issued. The up to date charges can

- You must nominate an approved Official Veterinarian (OV) to carry out the registration visit.
  If you do not know the name of an approved OV, please contact the office at the head of this form.
- Your OV will require payment for services carried out. This is a private arrangement between you and your OV.
- The registration documentation will be sent to your OV in the first instance, not to you.
- It is the applicant's responsibility to comply with any other legal requirements applicable to the ownership and movement of circus animals and animal acts.

It is necessary for passports to be issued to each animal in the circus and therefore section 2 below is designed to ensure we issue to correct number of passports to your OV. There are 2 types of passport, one for birds and rodents, which is treated as a group passport, and one for individual animals. On the bird and rodent passport, only a single species can be on one passport, and the bird/rodents must be of the same breed. Where birds or rodents are individually identified, there is no limit on the numbers per passport.
