1.	Introductions  All attendees introduced themselves and which organisation they represented.	
2.	Review of previous Minutes and Actions  The previous minutes were accepted with no amendments requested.  Rainbow Maps – These have successfully been re-issued, if any HA has not received them contact HS2 directly to resolve.  Winter Plan – PT reported that after cross checking the lorry routes with the gritting routes, it was found that there are not significant differences identified – for the data that was provided to EDP. The issue is to be devolved down to contractors to discuss with highway authorities locally.  Action – HS2 Ltd to circulate winter gritting route plans.  ES assessment year – PT confirmed that if no new planning permissions were required then any new environmental assessment would be undertaken as if it had been done when the ES was produced and therefore no new assessment year would be assessed. It was agreed that the Phase 1/2a document would be consulted on with the Phase 2a authorities and then amendments consulted on with the phase 1 Authorities.

HS2 Ltd is currently working on how its review and acceptance of consent submissions is communicated to HA's on the forms.

HS2 Ltd operates a 'responsible client' model, taking a risk-based approach to reviewing consent-related documentation from contractors. The extent of reviews of the contractor's self-certified designs is dependent on factors such as the scope / nature of the works and the contractor's performance in meeting quality requirements, with the purpose being to concentrate on higher-risk activities.

However, HS2 Ltd remains accountable as nominated undertaker for all works carried out under Act powers.

HA's raised a question regarding consents that get obtained where the work is not carried out within the dates specified on the consent submissions, PT explained that once a consent is obtained or deemed, or if the consultation end date has passed for consultation only submissions, then as long as the works and plans specified within the submission do not change, a new submission would not be needed. However contractors would be expected to consult with HA's on revised dates, to ensure lack of conflict with other activities within the local area.

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**Action –** HA's to provide comments to HS2 Ltd on forms; HW0 'Agreement in Principle for Highway-related Departures' & HW12 'S33 P1 Property of Highway Authority' (version P01), by the end of Friday the 06/07/18.

## 8 <u>Dispute Resolution</u>

PT presented on where the High Speed Rail (London to West Midlands) Act stood on the issue of Dispute Resolution, Contractors would be expected to avoid disputes via various means and methods first. If this does not resolve the dispute it would then be escalated (see presentation slides for more info)..

In accordance with the RTMP, a dispute resolution procedure had been considered by HS2 and was presented to the Highways Sub Group (see presentation slides for more info).

## 9. Highway asset data - update The 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting of an Asset Data Working Group was held on the 22/05/18, the main points that have come from this are: Highways England data specification is probably too detailed for local highway authorities. Hertfordshire CC data specification may be best basis for local highway authorities. Highways England currently reviewing HS2 AD4s (Asset Data Dictionary Definition Documents) to undertake a gap analysis, expected to be completed at the end of June. Actions identified within this meeting: Definitive list of assets that will transfer to highway authorities. Demarcation lines for non-transferred assets where highway authorities still have an interest. Notification of temporary assets to highway authorities. Process if highway authorities wish to retain temporary assets as permanent improvements, Form HW15 'Agreement to Retaining Temporary Highway Works as Permanent Improvement' 10 **Feedback from Local TLG meetings** It was reported that in general TLGs have significantly improved, the issue of best practice was discussed, & area north and area central TLGs have mechanisms that could benefit each other. 11 **Forward Plan** PT presented on an indicative programme, there are currently no changes to assumed dates, based on Main Civils Works NTP being end February 2019. The topic of insurance claims that involve the public within areas of HS2 activities was raised as a point of discussion for the forward plan.
