The Armed Forces Covenant

An Enduring Covenant Between

The People of the United Kingdom Her Majesty's Government

and -

All those who serve or have served in the Armed Forces of the Crown

And their Families

The first duty of Government is the defence of the realm. Our Armed Forces fulfil that responsibility on behalf of the Government, sacrificing some civilian freedoms, facing danger and, sometimes, suffering serious injury or death as a result of their duty.

Families also play a vital role in supporting the operational effectiveness of our Armed Forces. In return, the whole nation has a moral obligation to the members of the Naval Service, the Army and the Royal Air Force, together with their families. They deserve our respect and support, and fair treatment.

Those who serve in the Armed Forces, whether Regular or Reserve, those who have served in the past, and their families, should face no disadvantage compared to other citizens in the provision of public and commercial services. Special consideration is appropriate in some cases, especially for those who have given most such as the injured and the bereaved.

This obligation involves the whole of society: it includes voluntary and charitable bodies, private organisations, and the actions of individuals in supporting the Armed Forces. Recognising those who have performed military duty unites the country and demonstrates the value of their contribution. This has no greater expression than in upholding this Covenant.

Section 1: Principles Of The Armed Forces Covenant

- 1.1 We Halfords Group plc will endeavour in our business dealings to uphold the key principles of the Armed Forces Covenant, which are:
 - no member of the Armed Forces Community should face disadvantage in the provision of public and commercial services compared to any other citizen
 - in some circumstances special treatment may be appropriate especially for the injured or bereaved.

Section 2: Demonstrating our Commitment

- 2.1 Halfords Group plc recognises the value serving personnel, reservists, veterans and military families bring to our business. We will seek to uphold the principles of the Armed Forces Covenant, by:
 - Promoting the fact that we are an armed forces-friendly organisation;
 - seeking to support the employment of all Service leavers and Veterans by working with the Career Transition Partnership (CTP);
 - Offer Service Leavers guaranteed placement in to the interview process for all roles within Halfords Group (provided applicants meet the minimum requirements)
 - supporting our employees who choose to be members of the Reserve forces, including
 accommodating their training and deployment where possible and offering an additional 10
 days unpaid leave;
 - Offering a commercial discount through the Defence Discount Scheme:
 - 10% off all purchases in Halfords retail stores
 - 10% off servicing in Halfords Autocentres
 - Half Price MOT in Halfords Autocentres
 - Free MOT with a full or major service in Halfords Autocentres
 - 5% off repairs in Halfords Autocentres
 - Support Reserves and Armed Forces Day;
 - Supporting Remembrance;
- 2.2 We will publicise these commitments through our literature and on our website, setting out how we will seek to honour them and inviting feedback from the Service community and our customers on how we are doing.
