BYE-LAWS.

1. No person is allowed on the foreshore between Gallagher and Jury Gut Coast Guard Stations during the hours of Artillery Practice, which will be made known by notices from time to time in the town of Lydd, and at the Commandant's Office in Camp, and by red flags hoisted at the Guard Tent in the Artillery Camp, and at Gallagher and Jury Gut Coast Guard Stations.

2. The Commandant, and any Officer for the time being under his command, and any Constable, is hereby authorized to remove from the said foreshore, or to take into custody without warrant, and bring before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, to be dealt with according to law, any person contravening this Bye-Law.

3. Any such person is, on conviction, liable to a fine not exceeding Five Pounds.
