**S31 Extended Personal Adviser duty Implementation Grant (New Burdens)  
Determination Letter 2019-20 [GR1000737] [No 31/3264]**

This Determination is made between:

- (1) **The Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Children and Families** and
- (2) **The local authorities listed at Annex A**

**Purpose of the grant**

The Children and Social Work Act 2017 introduced a new duty on local authorities, requiring them to offer Personal Adviser support to all care leavers up to age 25. This duty came into force on 1 April 2018.

The purpose of this grant is to provide support to local authorities in England, to help them to meet the requirements of this duty, in response to young people that may request such support from the local authority after the age of 21 and up to their 25<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Local authorities can spend this grant to support the costs associated with meeting this duty. In doing so, they should take account of the statutory guidance [Extending Personal Adviser support to all care leavers to age 25](#) published on 26 February 2018, to help local authorities implement this extended duty.

## **Extended personal adviser duty grant termination 2019/20 [GR1000737] [No 31/3264]**

The Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Children and Families (“Parliamentary Under Secretary of State”), in exercise of the powers conferred by section 31 of the Local Government Act 2003, makes the following determination:

### **Citation**

1) This determination may be cited as the extended Personal Adviser duty grant Determination 2019/20 [No 31/3264].

### **Purpose of the grant**

2) The purpose of the grant is to provide support to local authorities in England towards expenditure lawfully incurred or to be incurred by them in response to young people that may request such support from the local authority after the age of 21 and up to their 25th birthday.

### **Determination**

3) The Parliamentary Under Secretary of State determines the authorities to which grant is to be paid and the amount of grant to be paid; these are set out in Annex A.

### **Treasury consent**

4) Before making this determination in relation to local authorities in England, the Parliamentary Under Secretary of State obtained the consent of the Treasury.

### **Payment arrangements**

5) The total grant to be paid to each authority is set out at Annex A. Grant will be paid in four instalments of as near equal value as possible, on 24 May, 23 August, 22 November and 21 February 2020.
