Liquor Licensing

England and Wales, July 2003–June 2004

27 October 2004

Main Points

- The total number of on-licensed premises at 30 June 2004 was 113,000, about 5,700 (5 per cent) more than twelve years ago. There is a gradual ongoing upwards trend despite some small fluctuations.
- The number of off-licensed premises at 30 June 2004 was 46,600. This number has fluctuated slightly over recent years with no clear trend.
- There were just over 5,000 new applications for on-licences and about 2,950 new applications for off-licences in the year to June 2004. In both cases over 19 out of every 20 applications were granted.
- Some 350 licences were revoked in the year to June 2004, of which 270 were on-licences.
- As at 30 June 2004 there were 12,200 Special Hours certificates in force. During the previous twelve months nearly 1,900 new certificates were granted.
- 55,000 occasional permissions were granted to 25,000 organisations.

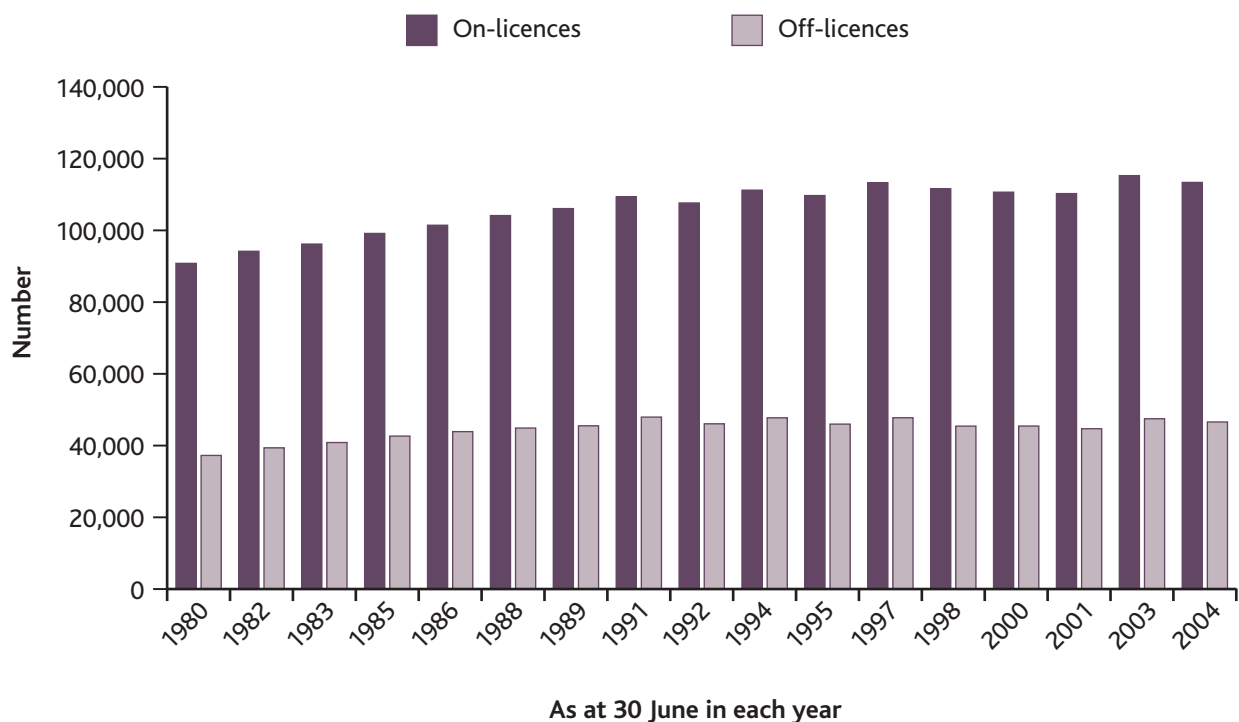


Figure 1: Premises Licensed for the Retail Sale of Intoxicating Liquor, England and Wales, 1980–2004

Commentary

On-licensed premises (Table 1)

On 30 June 2004 there were 113,000 on-licensed premises, a rise of 3,100 (3 per cent) from the number recorded in June 2001, the last time a full survey was carried out. However, responses to the 2004 survey indicated that the number of on-licences had fallen by 1,900 (2 per cent) since June 2003.¹

Compared with 1992, twelve years, or four reporting cycles, ago, the overall number of on-licences has risen by 5,700 (5 per cent). There was a steady rise in the number of on-licences until the early 1990s, since when numbers have fluctuated slightly but still show a gradual upwards trend.

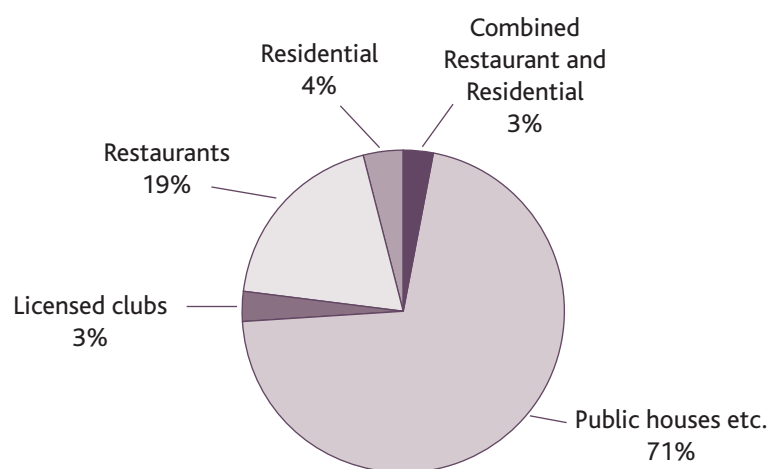


Figure 2: On-Licensed Premises by type, England and Wales, 30 June 2004

Types of on-licence (Tables 1 and 2, figure 2)

Compared with twelve years ago, the largest growth has been in “general” full on-licences (i.e. public houses, etc.) which rose 7,400 (10 per cent) to 81,500; and restaurant licences, which were up 1,500 (8 per cent) to 21,300.

The proportion of all on-licences represented by full on-licences has climbed from 69 per cent twelve years ago to 71 per cent three years ago and 72 per cent now. Despite the increase in actual numbers of restaurant-only licences, they have accounted for just under 19 per cent of all on-licences for at least the last twelve years.

In contrast to the growth in restaurant-only licences, the numbers of residential and combined restaurant and residential licences have both fallen over the twelve year period, by 34 and 27 per cent respectively.

There were 3,750 licensed clubs. This is almost identical to the number recorded in 2001 but about 500 fewer than the peak in the mid-1990s.

¹The survey collected data on licences in force as at June 2003 and June 2004. The most reliable comparisons are between those years when a survey took place, for example 2004 and 2001.

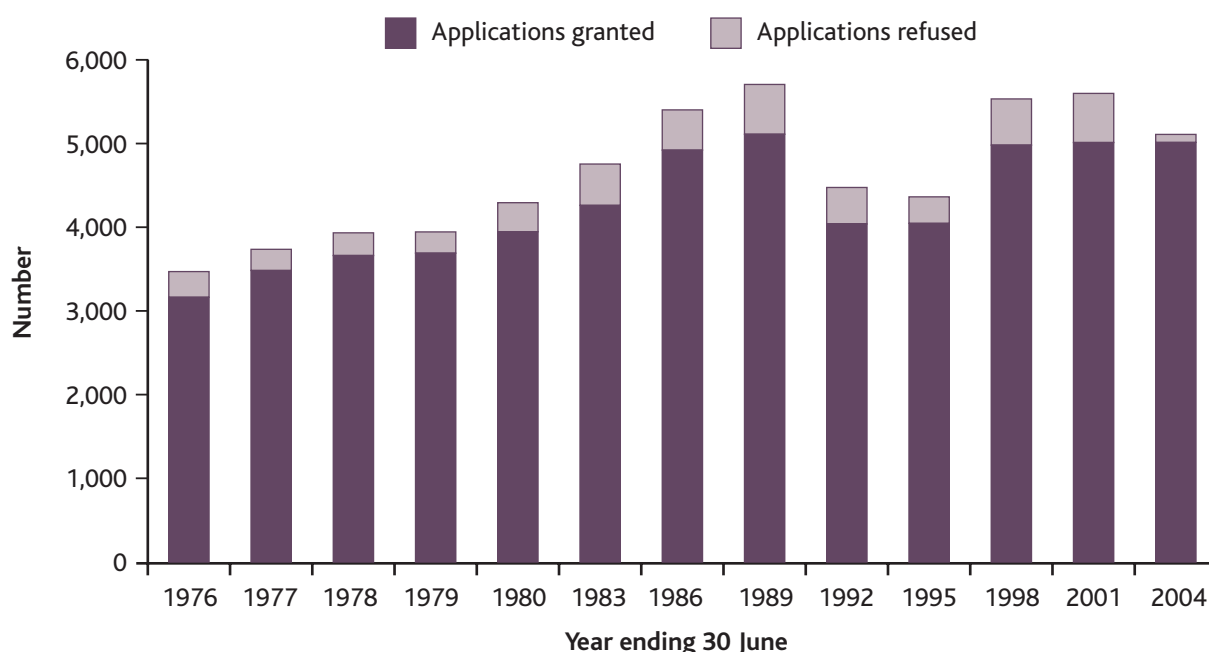


Figure 3: Applications for On-Licences dealt with, by outcome, England and Wales, 1976-2004

New applications for on-licences (Table 3, figure 3)

During the twelve months ending 30 June 2004 there were just over 5,000 new applications for on-licences, almost exactly the same as the number in each of the last two surveys (three and six years ago). The success rate was 98 per cent which is a marked increase from the success rate of 88 per cent last time. 71 per cent of new applications were for full on-licences (pubs etc.) and 27 per cent were for restaurant and residential licences. The success rate was 98 per cent for both applications for full on-licences (3,490 granted out of 3,550 applications) and applications for restaurant and residential licences (1,320 out of 1,350 applications).

The picture in the early 1990s (four reporting cycles ago) was somewhat different in that full on-licence applications represented only 54 per cent of the whole and restaurants and residential licence applications accounted for 42 per cent. Success rates were lower than now, with 86 per cent of full on-licence applications approved and 93 per cent of restaurant and residential licence applications approved.

Geographical distribution of on-licences (Table 9)

The highest densities of on-licensed premises per head of population are to be found in central London (particularly 'City of London'), Cumbria, the Isle of Wight, North Yorkshire and Devon & Cornwall. In general these are areas where tourism is the main, or an important, industry. The lowest densities are to be found in parts of outer London and in areas of the Midlands including the West Midlands, Northamptonshire and Derbyshire.

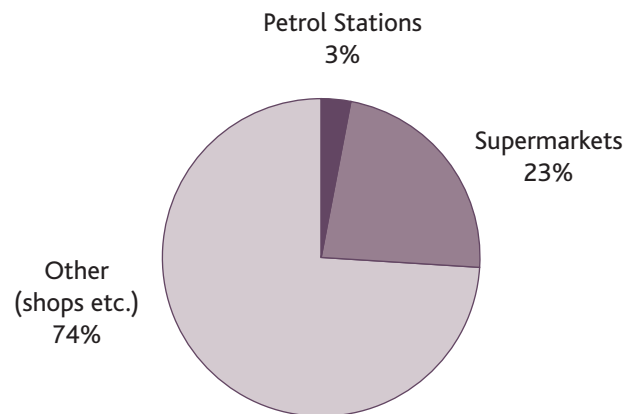


Figure 4: Off-Licensed Premises by type, England and Wales, 30 June 2004

Off-licensed premises (Tables 1 and 3, figure 4)

The number of off-licensed premises on 30 June 2004 was 46,600, an increase of 2,200 since the previous survey three years previous and an increase of 800 since 1992. The number of off-licences climbed till the early 1990s and has fluctuated slightly since then, but the figure for 2004 is a new peak.

Supermarkets (defined for these purposes as those shops with a selling area of over 2000 sq. ft. or 186 sq. metres) have increased their share and now represent 23 per cent, up by 5 percentage points from three years earlier. Petrol Stations have increased their share to 3 per cent, up by 2 percentage points. Other types of off-licence, such as shops possessing an off-licence, now make up 74 per cent of the total.

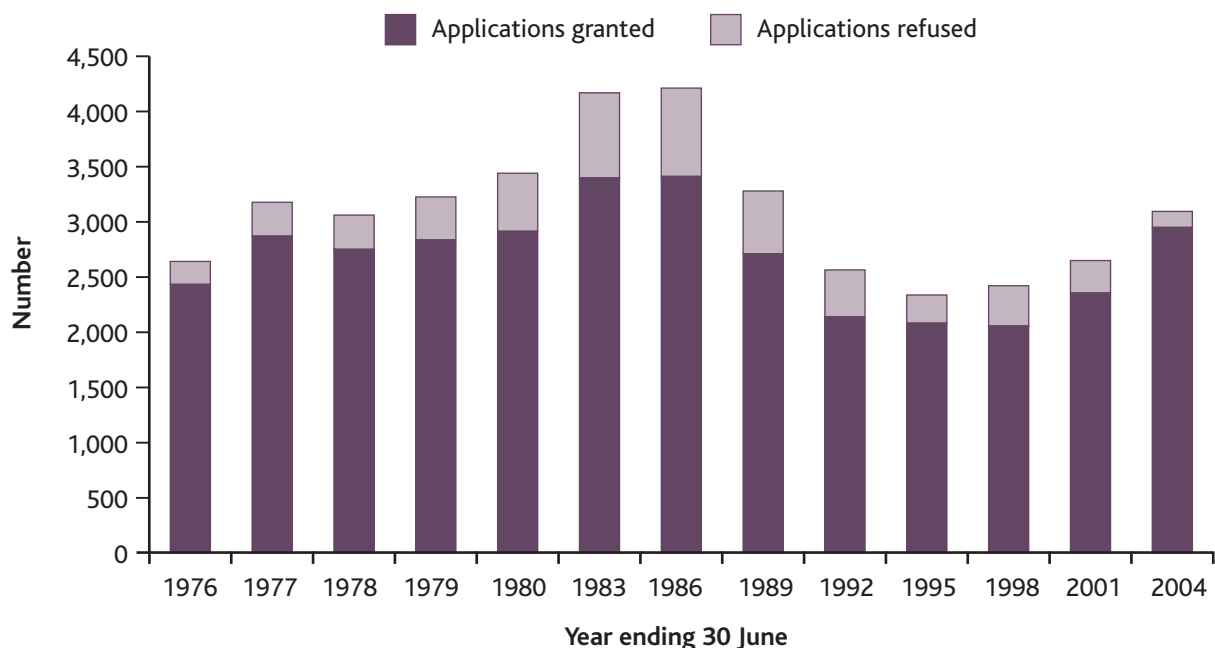


Figure 5: Applications for Off-Licences dealt with, by outcome, England and Wales 1976-2004

New applications for off-licences (Table 3, figure 5)

There were 2,950 applications for off-licences in the year ending 30 June 2004. This was about 600 more than the number recorded in 2001 and 900 more than the numbers recorded in 1998 and 1995, but still somewhat lower than the peak of around 3,400 recorded in the mid-1980s. Of the applications made in 2003-04, about 2,800 (95 per cent) were granted, an increase of 8 percentage points since 2001.

Geographical distribution of off-licences (Table 9)

The distribution of off-licences is similar to that of on-licences. The highest densities of off-licences held per head of population are to be found in central London (particularly 'City of London'), mid- and west Wales, Cumbria, Dorset and Devon & Cornwall. The lowest densities are to be found in Northamptonshire, Derbyshire, Gloucestershire and a number of counties in the South-East and East of England.

Licences revoked (Table 5)

In the twelve months ending 30 June 2004 a total of 354 licences were revoked; 273 on-licences and 81 off-licences. This is nearly twice as many as recorded in the last survey in 2001 but is in line with the previous surveys in the late 1990s. As in previous years the main category of licence to be revoked was for full on-licences (e.g. pubs). This figure reached a new peak of 186 revoked licences, accounting for nearly 70 per cent of all revoked on-licences.

Special Hours certificates (Table 6)

During the twelve month period ending on 30 June 2004, some 2,122 applications were made of which 1,860 (88 per cent) were granted. The number of applications was slightly down from 2001 but up from the numbers recorded in the 1990s. The success rate is very similar to that noted in 2001 and 1998. At 30 June 2004 there were over 12,200 Special Hours certificates in force.

Occasional Permissions (Table 7)

Applications for occasional permissions were received from 24,600 organisations in the year ending 30 June 2004. This figure was up by nearly 3,000 from the previous survey in 2001, but similar to the figures recorded through the 1990s. There were 54,500 applications, of which 53,600 were granted; a success rate of 98 per cent, which is very similar to previous years. The number of applications was up by a third from 2001 and there has been a clear upward trend since the 1980s.

Children's certificates (Table 8)

In the year ending 30 June 2004 there were around 1,120 applications for children's certificates, of which 1,030 (92 per cent) were granted. This success rate is similar to the past couple of surveys but is well up from the mid 1990s. The total number of applications is the highest recorded since 1996 and reverses a downward trend. At 30 June 2004 there were 7,200 children's certificates in force.

Restriction orders and Extended Hours orders

The Licensing Act 1988 contained a provision for restriction orders to be made in order to avoid unforeseen nuisance or disturbance arising from the extended afternoon opening hours permitted by the Act. In the twelve months to 30 June 2004, only one such grant was reported.

Extended hours orders allow alcohol to be served up to 1 a.m. on certain days in on-licensed premises where substantial refreshment and entertainment are also provided; for this reason most of these orders are made in favour of restaurant-type premises. In the year ending 30 June 2004, 86 applications were made, of which 71 were granted. There are currently 1,530 orders in force.

Notes and Definitions

Public houses, etc	Public houses, hotels etc. (other than those licensed under Part IV of the Licensing Act 1964) having a justices' on-licence. A justices' on-licence authorises the sale of intoxicating liquor for consumption on or off the premises, unless a condition is attached to the licence prohibiting off-sales.
Restaurant and residential licences	Premises with a restaurant, residential or combined restaurant and residential licence under Part IV of the Licensing Act 1964.
Licensed clubs	Clubs licensed under Section 55 of the Licensing Act 1964, including clubs holding a justices' licence which is also a Part IV licence under the Licensing Act 1964.
Off licences	Premises with a justices' licence to sell intoxicating liquor for consumption off the premises.
Theatres	Premises used for the performance of stage plays, whether under Royal Patent or licensed under the Theatres Act 1968, in which intoxicating liquor can be sold without a justices' licence (Licensing Act 1964, section 199(c)).
Registered clubs	Clubs registered under Section 40 of the Licensing Act 1964.
Special Hours certificates	Certificates granted under sections 76 to 83 of the Licensing Act 1964 to permit the sale and consumption of liquor during specified times on particular days outside of licensing hours. These certificates apply to on-licensed premises and registered clubs which have a music and dancing licence and provide substantial refreshment; and also to casino premises which provide gaming facilities and substantial refreshment. A certificate remains in force until revoked.
Occasional permissions	Permissions granted under the Licensing (Occasional Permissions) Act 1983 to representatives of charitable and non-profit-making organisations authorising the sale of alcohol at particular functions.
Children's certificates	Since 3 January 1995, licensing justices may grant Children's Certificates to permit accompanied children under 14 to enter the bar area of licensed premises. Section 19 and Schedule 7 of the Deregulation and Contracting Out Act 1994 have inserted into the Licensing Act 1964 provisions which allow children under 14 accompanied by an adult to be admitted to certificated bar premises in certain circumstances. Before granting a certificate, licensing justices must be satisfied that the bar area to which an application relates constitutes an environment in which it is suitable for children under 14 to be present, and that meals and beverages other than intoxicating liquor will be available for consumption in that area. Licensing justices are also able to impose other conditions, including restrictions on the days or hours during which the certificate is operational. Certificates will normally be operational up to 9 p.m. but earlier or later times may be specified. A certificate remains in force until revoked.
Restriction orders	Section 3 of the Licensing Act 1988 inserted new Sections 67a-67d into the

1964 Act providing for the making of restriction orders. These orders require particular premises to close for some or all of the hours between 2.30 p.m. and 5.30 p.m. on some or all weekdays for a maximum of twelve months.

Extended Hours Orders

Orders granted under section 70 of the Licensing Act 1964 to permit the sale and consumption of liquor until 1.00am on particular days in on-licensed premises and registered clubs which provide substantial refreshment and entertainment. The supply of liquor in these premises must be ancillary to the provision of refreshment and entertainment so that, in practice, these orders are mostly given to restaurant type premises. An order remains in force until revoked.

Methodology

1. There was a response rate of over 99% to the questionnaire sent to each petty sessional area in England and Wales. Figures were estimated for the small number of outstanding areas and also in those cases where only a partial return was received. The main reasons for partial returns were:
 - Supermarkets are defined as those premises with a floor space of over 186 square metres. Some petty sessional areas did not have these details available and had to estimate the number of licensed supermarkets based on company names.
 - Not all respondents were able to provide accurate information on the number of applications and grants of occasional permissions. In these cases the figures have been imputed.
 - In some cases the data returned were not consistent; for example, sometimes the totals did not match the sum of the different types of licences. The data in these cases were adjusted to correct this.
2. Mid-2003 population estimates were used to calculate the per 10,000 population figures in Table 9. These estimates were produced by the Office for National Statistics.
3. Liquor licensing statistics are classed as National Statistics. As such they conform to standards of high quality, as well as relevance and integrity. This is assured by adherence to the National Statistics Code of Practice and its protocols. Further information

This is the first time these statistics have been produced by the Department for Culture, Media and Sport. The Department inherited responsibility for these statistics, as part of the transition of responsibility for alcohol and entertainment legislation, in 2001.
