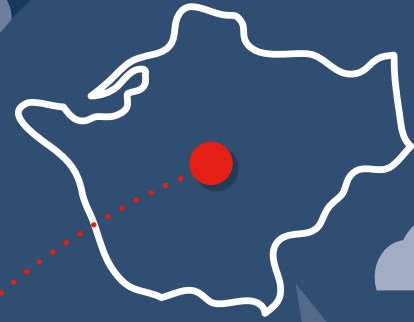
Industrial Strategy highlights include:

 **£55m** of investment for the Medicines Discovery Catapult in Alderley Edge, which is focused on using newly industrialised technologies, such as the power of sound energy to deliver new medicines to patients, faster.

 **£10m** for Crewe High Speed Ready Heart – preparing for a High Speed 2 Hub Station by regenerating Crewe Town Centre.

 **£10m** to accelerate housebuilding by providing the vital infrastructure needed to access new and existing sites.

 **449,900** people in employment, an increase of **12,100** since 2010. **29,000** workers directly benefiting from the National Living and Minimum Wages. **6,770** apprenticeships starts last year.

Case study:
National Centre for Agri-tech and Advanced Engineering

The National Centre for Agri-tech and Advanced Engineering in Reaseheath will provide specialised facilities for robotics, tractor simulation, GPS and the most advanced agricultural engineering machines associated with precision farming. The £2.4m funding will also provide workshop space, and upskilling to meet future skills needs.
