

# **Application Form**

The Urban Tree Challenge Fund (UTCF) provides support for planting trees across England's Towns and Cities. The Fund provides capital funding to plant and establish trees that are an appropriate size for the setting in which they are planted, be it a street tree or a small community woodland. In addition to completing this application form you will need to fill in the accompanying annex and prepare maps of the planting sites that are included in your application. Guidance is embedded within the form and annex with further information available from <a href="mailto:gov.uk">gov.uk</a>. In 2019/20 the UTCF is only open to applicants who are submitting a block bid, these are applications that contain a number of single planting sites that combined have a total grant value of £500,000 or more.

You must not start work until you have a signed agreement with the Forestry Commission in place.

We are required to collect a number of personal details from the applicant, land agent, or landlord to be able to process your application. Further information on how we will use your information and your rights under the UK's data protection legislation can be found at the end of this form.

#### Part 4.1 – Grant Funding

The table below sets out the funding that is available per tree and the activities that need to be undertaken for that funding. The grant contributes 50% of the full cost of undertaking the listed activities. The cost for large trees is based on planting using a tree pit in a grass verge. Other settings and footway surfaces are acceptable, but no additional funding will be made available. Protection measures including the type of guard used (if a guard is required), must be appropriate for the planting location. This

must be removed when it is no longer needed and disposed of or recycled in line with waste legislation and regulations.

A single planting site must consist of a minimum of 150 feather or whip size trees planted at a minimum spacing of 1m x 1m; for large trees a minimum of 10 will need to be planted in one area. Details, including tree numbers, protection measures, species choice and the location for each single planting site must be provided by completing the annex that accompanies this form.

Each of the three tree types is defined as follows;

- **Large Tree -** Trees with a clear stem up to 1.8m from ground evel branches. They come in a range of sizes and age is dependent on species and growth rate. Generally larger standard trees are selected for more vulnerable areas such as in close proximity to schools, pubs and high footfall locations, whilst smaller ones are used in quiet suburban roads.
- Feather Small trees that have a central stem with some side branches and are usually between 150cm and 175cm in height. They are usually between four to six years old, depending on species and growth rite. Eathers are suitable for planting singly, in small groups, or in stand in school grounds, parks, woodland, wider highway verges and informal open space.
- Whip Whips are very small single storn plants with little or no side shoots usually just about a year in age. They are usually between 100cm to 125cm in height. Whips are suitable for planting in larger groups or blocks to create a feature, extend existing woodland and create impact in school grounds, parks, wider highway verges and informal open space.

#### Part 4.3 - Claim schedule

Tree planting can take place over two planting seasons: 2019/20 expectation is that at least 60% of planting will happen in 19/20. Once the work has been completed you will need to submit a claim form to a ceive payment. The year the trees are planted is year zero, this will be followed by thee years of establishment payments. For example if you plant in 2019/20 then establishment payments will cover work undertaken in 20/21, 21/22 and 22/23.

Payments will be made in two instalments, the irst instalment will cover the supply and planting of the tree plus one year of establishment costs (watering and weeding). This will be followed by a further, final payment two years later for the remaining establishment costs. Please set out your claim schedule using the tables below.

Requests to amend the claim schedule will be reviewed by the Forestry 7ommission but may not be approved and this will be subject to budget availability.

## Part 5 – How we process your application

Once we receive your application we will acknowledge it and make some basic checks to confirm your proposal is eligible. We may need to contact you to finalise some of the details. Once the application window has closed alkblock bids will be scored and ranked. Points will be awarded based on the proportion of trees in the total application that are within the Priority People layer and Priority Naces layer. Priority People and Priority Places are evenly weighted with the same number of points available for each, applications in a location which meets both Priority People and Priority Places will score twice.

Applicants will receive a score for large trees and small trees separately and these will be assessed during the scoring and ranking process. Value for money will also be used as a point of differentiation between comparable applications; this will be based on the direct cost of the proposal to Defra. Applicants that are able to match fund more than 50% of the cost of the work and subsequently request a lower rate of grant funding (by requesting this in the application annex) will receive a higher score.

Following scoring and ranking of your application we may contact you to discuss the number of trees in your application and the potential to remove or change single planting sites to fit with available funding. This will also help to ensure that overall the fund supports approximately a 5:1 ratio of small trees to large trees.

Successful applicants will receive an agreement offer from September 2019. All formal agreement offers will be subject to your proposal passing basic eligibility checks. You must not start work (including the purchase of stock) until you have accepted a formal agreement offer from the Forestry Commission. Doing so will invalidate any claim later submitted under an Agreement.

Where planting is spread across multiple years we will only accept one claim each financial year. A claim form will be sent to all Agreement Holders and is available on request. Claims may be subject to inspection before payment and payment will be made by BACS transfer.

A copy of the Terms and Conditions that apply are available on the web page. You must read these carefully and will need to agree to them in order to accept an agreement

offer. If, for any reason and at any stage, you do not wish to go ahead with planting, please let us know by writing to the address in Part 8 at the earliest opportunity. This will allow us to reallocate funds to new applications.

#### Part 6 – Data Protection Act 2018

The Forestry Commission (FC) will use any information you provide, to support the administration of the scheme. Without your personal information, we will not be able to process your application. The FC or its appointed agents may also use it, in keeping with the safeguards of the Data Protection Act, in the following ways:
