	With the support of the Assay Offices the Council ran the Touchstone Award during 2018 and is planning to repeat this during 2019. The Touchstone Award, whose purpose is to enhance awareness of hallmarking and is presented to the Trading Standards Department which has taken the most innovative approach to raising the profile of hallmarking, is regarded as an important, yet cost-effective, way of raising the profile of hallmarking among the Trading Standards community.
	The Council via the Secretary receives numerous telephone and email queries from members of the public usually relating to the application of hallmarking law or concerns about jewellery purchased which did not appear to be hallmarked. Responses are sent to all queries.
