NOTES

1. These characters occur only in loanwords, and are represented in the same style as in the BGN/PCGN Romanization System for Russian.

2. These characters should be Romanized **ye** or **yë** word-initially and after vowels. In all other instances, they should be Romanized **e** or **ë**.
3. An inventory of letter-diacritic combinations, with their Unicode encoding, in addition to the unmodified letters of the basic Roman script is:

All apostrophes appearing in romanization are U+2019

4. The Roman-script columns show only lowercase forms but, when applying the table, uppercase and lowercase Roman letters as appropriate should be used.
