The Aggregates Levy was announced at Budget 2000 with the following objectives:

"An aggregates levy will ensure that the environmental impacts of aggregates production not already addressed by regulation are more fully reflected in prices, encouraging a shift in demand away from virgin aggregate towards alternative materials such as recycled aggregate."

This review will look at the objectives and the impact of the levy, how effective the current design of the levy is, and the environmental and business context of the production and supply of all kinds of aggregate and the extraction of other construction materials. The review will consider potential reforms that could be made to the Aggregates Levy.
