PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information on the movement of gamebirds which we received on 29 October 2018. Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOI).

The information you requested and our response is detailed below:

- 1. 'Statistics outlining the number of pheasants, partridges and eggs of these species imported into the UK for game shooting, for each of the years 2015 2018.
- 2. Statistics outlining the number of pheasants, partridges and eggs of these species exported from the UK for game shooting, for each of the years 2015 2018.
- Copies of importation certificates, journey logs and related paperwork including the starting and finishing destination – relating to the transport of pheasant and partridge chicks and eggs for shooting through the Port of Dover by vehicles with the (French) registration plates BR-104-QB, EA-970-DD, CD-189-RS between February and July 2018.
- 4. Copies of export certificates, journey logs and related paperwork including the starting and finishing destination – relating to the transport of pheasant and partridge chicks and eggs for shooting through the Port of Holyhead, between February and July 2018.'

The Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) can access information for species of animals that require a health certificate through TRACES (Trade Control and Expert System) which is a European Commission system employed by EU member states to facilitate and record animal/animal product movements into and throughout the EU.

The enclosed information was extracted from TRACES by searching for pheasants and partridges certified for the purpose of game re-stocking for the years 2015 to 2018 for import and export.

The Animal and Plant Health Agency is an Executive Agency of the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs working to safeguard animal and plant health for the benefit of people, the environment and the economy.

APHA are unable to identify any consignments for pheasant and partridge eggs as these cannot be certified for the purpose of game re-stocking as this is not an option on certification therefore it is not possible to know if eggs have gone for this purpose.

APHA could not find any records for vehicle identification registration plates BR-104-QB, EA-970-DD, and CD-189-RS between February and July 2018 relating to the transport of pheasants, partridges, and their eggs as recorded for the purpose of game re-stocking by the authorities in the country of origin. As it is not a requirement for the vehicle registration to be recorded on TRACES at the point of certification we cannot provide further information.

All consignments identified were movements of game birds. As these species of animals do not require a journey log or rest stops and it is not mandatory to record the port of entry/exit on TRACES, APHA are not able to identify consignments imported through the Port of Dover or exported through the Port of Holyhead.

Any information provided is a true reflection of the information that we have access to. APHA can't guarantee the accuracy of this data, as we can only rely on the information that has been entered into TRACES by a third party.

Information disclosed in response to this FOI request is releasable to the public. In keeping with the spirit and effect of the FOI and the government's Transparency Agenda, this letter and the information disclosed to you may be placed on GOV.UK, together with any related information that will provide a key to its wider context.
