PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information on bee colonies which we received on 14 November 2018. Your request has been handled under the Environmental Regulation Information 2004(EIR).

The information you requested and our response is detailed below:

- '- I'd like to get a sense of how the number of UK colonies has changed over the last 120 years. So perhaps the number in 1900, in 1925, 1950, 1975, 2000, 2018.
- I'm also interested to know how many beekeepers we've had during this timeframe, for those same dates.'

The Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) is an Executive Agency of the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs. APHA only holds records for Great Britain (England, Scotland and Wales).

BeeBase, in its current form, where beekeepers could register online, was launched in April 2006 hence some of the data in the earlier years or prior to this, is either not held in the requested form or is very immature. Scottish beekeepers have only been able to register since June 2010.

Where data is recorded as '0' we assume this to mean 'data is available and recorded as a zero value'. However, given the historic nature of some of the data provided and changes to county boundaries over time, caution should be taken to the accuracy of these figures as it is more likely that '0' values (or erratic values) recorded in the earlier years (especially 2006-2008) are actually a reflection of the lack of accurate data being available, rather than a true zero value.

The information in the table at Appendix 1 was taken from BeeBase which is the APHA National Bee Unit website. It is designed for bee keepers and supports Defra, Welsh Government and Scotland's Bee Health Programmes and the Healthy Bees Plan, which set out to protect and sustain our valuable national bee stocks.

When referencing 'colony numbers', we are specifically referring to 'registered' honey bee colonies.

When referencing 'beekeeper numbers', we are specifically referring to 'registered' honey beekeepers.

BeeBase is a voluntary registration system, the data is only representative of those bee keepers and colonies registered and the information is dependent upon beekeepers updating their records.

The annualised figure may not necessarily be at the same time point each year. For 2018, the report was run in October 2018.

Please see Appendix 1 for the information taken from BeeBase.
