Termination Warning Notice to the Members and Directors/Trustees of the Advance Trust (“the Trust”) in respect of Vale of Evesham School (“the academy”)

In accordance with section 2A of the Academies Act 2010 any funding agreement of an academy may be terminated by the Secretary of State where special measures are required to be taken by the academy or the academy requires significant improvement and the Chief Inspector of Ofsted has given notice of that under section 13(3)(a) of the Education Act 2005.

I received an Ofsted notification following the Inspection on 6-7 November 2019 confirming that Vale of Evesham School was judged to be inadequate and requires significant improvement.

My consideration of this matter has taken into account:


- the findings of the recent Ofsted Inspection.
- Advance Trust now has two schools which have recently been judged Inadequate.
- I had previously concluded that the Trust did not have the capacity to secure rapid and sustainable improvement in respect of Newbridge Short Stay Secondary School and issued a Termination Warning Notice on 1 November 2019.

I have concluded that the Trust does not have the capacity to secure rapid and sustainable school improvement at the academy. I am therefore issuing a Termination Warning Notice in respect of Vale of Evesham School.

In making the decision on whether to terminate the funding agreement I will consider any additional written representations you wish to make. Please provide me with any representations you have by 18 February 2020.
