The Armed Forces Covenant

An Enduring Covenant Between

The People of the United Kingdom
Her Majesty's Government

and -

All those who serve or have served in the Armed Forces of the Crown

And their Families

The first duty of Government is the defence of the realm. Our Armed Forces fulfil that responsibility on behalf of the Government, sacrificing some civilian freedoms, facing danger and, sometimes, suffering serious injury or death as a result of their duty. Families also play a vital role in supporting the operational effectiveness of our Armed Forces. In return, the whole nation has a moral obligation to the members of the Naval Service, the Army and the Royal Air Force, together with their families. They deserve our respect and support, and fair treatment.

Those who serve in the Armed Forces, whether Regular or Reserve, those who have served in the past, and their families, should face no disadvantage compared to other citizens in the provision of public and commercial services. Special consideration is appropriate in some cases, especially for those who have given most such as the injured and the bereaved.

This obligation involves the whole of society: it includes voluntary and charitable bodies, private organisations, and the actions of individuals in supporting the Armed Forces. Recognising those who have performed military duty unites the country and demonstrates the value of their contribution. This has no greater expression than in upholding this Covenant.

Section 1: Principles of the Armed Forces Covenant

- 1.1 We **Victoria & Mapperley Practice** will endeavour in our business dealings to uphold the key principles of the Armed Forces Covenant, which are:
 - no member of the Armed Forces Community should face disadvantage in the provision of public and commercial services compared to any other citizen
 - in some circumstances special treatment may be appropriate especially for the injured or bereaved.

Section 2: Demonstrating our Commitment

- 2.1 We recognise the value of serving personnel, reservists, veterans and military families; and will aim to uphold the principles of the Armed Forces Covenant, by seeking to:
 - promote the fact that we are an Armed Forces-friendly practice, to our staff, patients, suppliers, contractors and wider public;
 - register as an accredited Armed Forces Veteran friendly GP practice; having a process to
 identify veterans, making sure their military service is recognised in the care system in order to
 access mental and physical health care tailored to their needs;
 - support the employment of **Service spouses and partners**; working with and advertising vacancies with the military Families Federations; providing flexibility in granting leave for Service spouses and partners before, during and after a partner's deployment;
 - support our staff who are members of the Reserve Forces; granting additional leave for annual Reserve Forces training; supporting any mobilisations; actively encouraging and supporting membership of the Reserve Forces;
 - support our staff who are volunteer leaders in military cadet organisations, granting
 additional leave to attend annual training activities; actively encouraging and supporting
 membership of cadet organisations; supporting local cadet units;
 - support national events such as Armed Forces Day, Reserves Day, the Poppy Appeal Day and Remembrance activities;
 - support **Armed Forces charities** with fundraising and supporting staff who volunteer to assist;
- 2.2 We will publicise these commitments through our literature, on staff notices, on our website, and via our Patient Participation Group, setting out how we will seek to honour them and inviting feedback from the Service community and our customers on how we are doing.
