Thank you for your email of 8 September 2019 requesting the following information:

- [1] Please provide copies of communication (HQAC Staff, Region HQ Staff, Wing HQ Staff & OC Wings), and discussion/policy documents related to the review of the RAFAC Footprint in South West Region since September 2018. This would include discussion of closure or merging of units.
- [2] Please also include figures for the number of open squadrons across the corps, split by region for the last 3 years'. Clarified to: 'By open Squadrons I refer to Air Training Corps Squadrons that currently have enrolled cadets and are open to them for parade nights at least once a week. I could refine this further by calling them active Squadrons.'

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not normally investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
