Thank you for your email dated 18 April 2020 requesting the following information:

*“Could you please give the number of peoples tested positive and died by Service from the beginning of March to the present date caused by Covid 19”*

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that the information in scope of your request is held.

Between 1 March 2020 and 16 April 2020 (the latest data available), **121** UK armed forces personnel had a code for coronavirus (COVID-19) infection entered into their medical record (34 Naval Service<sup>1</sup>, 58 Army and 29 RAF personnel). Of these, **80** had been confirmed with test results.

**Two** of these UK armed forces personnel have subsequently died. Both personnel were from the Naval Service. Please note, this information is provisional until death certificates are received from NHS Digital and the General Register Office which confirms the cause of death.

Under section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance) you may find it useful to note:

MOD only hold data on NHS testing for UK armed forces personnel if test results have been supplied to Defence Primary Health Care providers for entry into the medical record.

Personnel include all UK armed forces regular and reserve trained and untrained personnel. Service was identified from the medical record

UK armed forces personnel with a confirmed case of COVID-19 were identified using:

- Electronic medical records (Defence Medical Information Capability Programme, DMICP) with a COVID-19 related read code. Please note that

DMICP is a live data source and is subject to change. Date of extract 17 April 2020.

- Notification of Casualty (NOTICAS) data where a positive test for COVID-19 was recorded.

The voluntary reserves not undertaking a MOD task receive their primary medical care from the NHS. Any information on COVID-19 entered in an NHS record is not held by MOD thus has not been included in the figures presented.

Defence Statistics Health receive daily notification of deaths from the Joint Casualty and Compassionate Centre via the Notification of Casualty (or "NOTICAS") system and have used this and other sources of military medical information to identify if the death was COVID-19 related. This information is therefore provisional until death certificates are received from NHS Digital and the General Register Office which confirms the cause of death.
