RE: Request for Information – RFI2918

Thank you for your request for information, which was processed under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). For clarification, you requested the following information:

Under the Freedom of Information Act- I would appreciate copies of ALL communication/ correspondence between yourselves and MHCLG, Kent County Council in relation to the KCC HIF Forward Funding bid.

One of our Councillors has just posted a link to an update and it mentions “Homes England have provided a collaborative support network to assist”. And “As part of this collaborative network, officers from MHCLG, their consultants, DfT, Homes England and Highways England partake in monthly conference calls to discuss progress”

Response

We can confirm that we do hold information that falls within the scope of your request, this is attached to this response as Annex A.

Please note that we have redacted and are withholding some information under the following Exemptions:

Section 40 – Personal information

We have redacted information on the grounds that it constitutes third party personal data and therefore engages section 40(2) of the FOIA.

To disclose personal data, such as names, contact details, addresses, email addresses and personal opinions could lead to the identification of third parties and would breach one or more of the data protection principles.

Section 40 is an absolute exemption which means that we do not need to consider the public interest in disclosure. Once it is established that the information is personal data of a third party and release would breach one or more of the data protection principles, then the exemption is engaged.

Section 43 - Commercial interests

Under section 43(2) Homes England is not obliged to disclose information that would, or would be likely to, prejudice the commercial interests of any party.

The information requested relating to the HIF bid engages section 43(2) of the FOIA as it is commercial in nature and its release would be likely to prejudice the commercial interests of Homes England and other interested parties to the information.

Homes England has identified that the information requested, if released, would be likely to prejudice the effective operation of the Housing Infrastructure Fund bidding process.

Section 43 is a qualified exemption. This means that once we have decided that the exemption is engaged, Homes England must carry out a public interest test to assess whether or not it is in the wider public interest for the information to be disclosed.

Arguments in favour of disclosure:

- Homes England acknowledges there is a general public interest in promoting accountability, transparency, public understanding and involvement in how Homes England undertakes its work and how it spends public money; and
- Homes England acknowledges there is significant local interest in the proposed development at Swale.

Arguments in favour of withholding:

- Releasing the information could reveal financial information which would affect both the Local Authority's and Homes England's commercial interests. This financial information relates to unverified approvals or funding sources and releasing these would make a presumption on the outcome and influence the decision making process. This would prejudice the impartiality of the bidding process making it less competitive. If Homes England had to assess bids that were not competitive, or in which a decision-maker could be influenced, this could result in inflated allocation of public funding which would not be in the public interest;
- Releasing information in relation to unconfirmed consultants would not be in the public interest as these are subject to due-diligence that has not yet been completed. If this information were in the public domain it would prejudice competition between consultants and compromise the future of the bidding process, making it a less competitive process which would not be in the public interest;
- Releasing information relating to forecast milestones (ie. Planning permission/consents) would not be in the public interest as to do so could be seen as influencing planning consents that have not yet been obtained. This would damage both the public perception of Homes England and the local authority and damage our relationships with partners. Releasing the information could be seen to undermine the formation of policy or decision making before it is finalised. This would put potential funding allocations at risk which would not be in the public interest as it could put potential homes in jeopardy;
- Releasing information on procurement options or proposed contractual clauses may limit the Local Authority's ability to make commercial decisions. The market would be pre-aware of terms intended ahead of the final bid and funding confirmation. This would negatively affect future competitive bidding processes as interested parties may feel unable to provide all of the information required for fear of disclosure. This



will mean that Homes England has to evaluate bids that are less comprehensive than would otherwise have been the case, meaning that Homes England's ability to undertake due diligence on the bids would be impaired. This would result in decision makers not taking all relevant information into account, meaning the decisions will be less robust and less likely to deliver value for public money. This would adversely affect the ability of government ministers and officials to be able to make effective, informed decisions;

- Releasing the information could lead to lobbying for future HIF bids that could impact the impartiality of the decision maker (or give rise to concerns on the part of others that impartiality could be adversely affected). It is essential that decision makers make decisions based on the information provided via the bidding process and be seen to do so. Therefore release of the information would not be in the public interest as it would impact the ability of Homes England to deliver against its objectives in our Strategic Plan;
- Releasing the information would mean that bids may be approved without appropriate challenge, and other bids may be rejected because needs and dependencies are not comprehensively stated. This will result in the HIF programme as a whole not delivering the objectives and benefits that HM Treasury stipulated when it made the funding available to Homes England; and
- Homes England has been unable to identify a wider public interest in disclosing the information requested.

Having considered the arguments for and against disclosure of the information, we have concluded that at this time, the balance of the public interest favours non-disclosure.

Following our previous letter outlining the co-development process, we are contacting you to set out the next steps for working with you to take your project forward.

Homes England will be your primary point of contact building on our existing working relationships with you. Therefore, we have identified S40(2) as your Homes England Local Lead contact for HIF.

We would like to meet with you to discuss your project to help us identify how best we can support you to develop your business case, and answer any questions that you have about how the process will work. Colleagues from MHCLG and Other Government Departments, including DfT, who have an interest in your bid will work with us throughout the co-development process and may attend our initial meeting.

To help the discussion, we have attached more details of the specific areas of your bid which we would like to explore further. This will help us to further understand your project, although we recognise that, at the initial meeting, we may not be able to cover every area we have highlighted for discussion.

We are currently looking into providing an offer of support to help you produce your economic case and further details of this will be made available in due course. To help us identify the level of support needed, please outline your progress to-date on assessing the economic benefits and costs of your project. We are not planning to focus on the economic case in the meeting, so please send this information to HIF@communities.gsi.gov.uk by 29th June. Further detail is set out in the attached Annex.

We would like the initial meeting to take place as soon as possible and we will be contacting you over the next week to arrange a suitable time and venue. If you have any queries in the meantime, contact us either through your identified Homes England Local Lead or via HIF@homesengland.gov.uk.

Alongside this work, with MHCLG colleagues, we want to identify further opportunities to target our departmental interventions to increase future housing supply in your area. We want to take a place-based approach to understand your local challenges to housing delivery, and the wider infrastructure and tools needed to address this. To identify these opportunities, we are proposing a programme of strategic engagement over the summer months. MHCLG colleagues have contacted your Chief Executive separately.



Good that we have a date in the diary for our follow-up meeting on 25th September. At the moment it will be just S40(2) and myself but I will advise you if S40(2) and S40(2) will be able to attend. We have been advised by Legal that we will need a cover letter to create the legal relationship necessary for provision of support for the HIF bid work, this is yet to be finalised but will follow soon.

Process:

The step-by-step process is, as follows:

- The 'request form' is filled by the bidding authority (or their nominee) for that project, typically after pre-discussions with the Local and Technical Leads. LAs should send this to OA Lead, Technical Lead and HIF inbox.
- The form is reviewed by the Local and Technical Leads, who then complete the 'recommendation form' to be considered by the HIF Forward Funding Panel.
- The Panel will review the 'recommendation form' to determine the appropriate level of support required – taking into account proposed approach and proportionality
- The Local Lead will send an award letter and accompanying annex to the bidding authority for that project.
- A responsible officer from the bidding authority will be required to countersign the award letter before support can be provided.
- A payment claim form will need to be completed where any 'cash in kind' support is required. This will be paid as defrayed expenditure and not upfront – LAs should submit invoices to Homes England who will verify and provide payment via Section 19 grant. For consultant support from panels – Homes England will procure (using appropriate procurement rules) and set up a TMS for the work. It should be noted that if there are any cost increases on procured work (either through the LA or Homes England) then these costs will need to be met by the Local Authority. This will be confirmed in the award letter, along with any other general conditions of award.



Many thanks for sending through an updated version of the land value uplift report reflecting the change to the unit numbers. We will work through this noting the changes you have made.

On this basis it would be helpful if a call could be arranged for tomorrow, ideally in the afternoon, between Deloitte, S40(2) and S40(2) (Homes England), S40(2) and S40(2) S40(2) (Steer) along with whoever is appropriate from the applicant client side.

The purpose of the call will be to review the implications of the updated report provided and also to review a number of the underlying assumptions that feed into the Economic Case. For example, the average unit size assumptions (we think that both 470-480 sq ft for a flat and possibly 1,000 sq ft for a house are smaller than we would expect, and have not been sufficiently evidence based).

In this context it would be helpful to have to hand the Development Assumptions input sheet within Steer's "Swale_LVU_v1.0.xlsx" cashflow, along with the document provided titled 'Attachment 6.1.8 Housing Costs Assumptions', to aid our discussion.

Just in case any further work is being undertaken from your side in regards to any unchanged sections of the Land Value Uplift Report (e.g. sensitivity tests), it might be prudent to pause this until after our discussion tomorrow afternoon.

Hope you are well. Apologies, but on top of S40(2) not being around, I was off sick yesterday. I've consulted with planning colleagues and the current position is as follows

SW Sittingbourne – The draft terms of the S106 Agreement were reported back to Members on 20th June. With a list of specific concerns, Members voted against approving these terms and voted to bring the whole application back to committee for consideration. Officers are currently seeking to find an appropriate date for a stand-alone committee to do this, which is likely to be in August or September.

Barton Hill Drive – the application is due to be reported back to the planning committee on the 18th July with an officer recommendation to approve.

3 applications covering the North West Sittingbourne allocation (listed as Land North of Quinton Road and Land at Great Grovehurst Farm in the site list) are likely to be reported in autumn with the intention to report all three to the same meeting. However in order to report the applications to Committee , officers are of the view that we will need to have ,among other things, a "no objection" response from Highways England(HE) and from KCC Highways, with concerns about impacts on Junction 5 M2, the A249 Junctions and the local road network. Negotiations are ongoing between the developers, HE officials and with KCC. Other potential issues still to be finalised are the need to get firm assurances from the developers to secure the provision of a school land to KCC at nil cost to them and via Network Rail to get confirmation that access/improvements to the Kemsley Halt have been resolved/secured – these matters are still ongoing but it is hoped will be resolved soon.

As promised I have liaised with my planning colleagues regarding the applications at South West Sittingbourne and North West Sittingbourne (for reference the latter relates to those sites identified as North of Quinton Road and Land at Great Grovehurst Farm). Rather than go through a raft of individual objections and points raised, I have sought to characterise the objection around the most common themes. None of the objections would be described as unexpected, and the it is the Highways concerns which present the principle challenges for the developments coming forward.

At SW Sittingbourne the nature of the community objections are focused on Highway / traffic flow impacts for the local road network and for the strategic road network and a perceived lack of infrastructure capacity across various areas include roads, schools, healthcare and services.

At NW Sittingbourne, it appears that the level of neighbour and local response for scheme of this size has been more limited, but of the concerns raised the focus has been around the impact on residential amenity (specifically to dwellings in Bramblefield Lane, the loss of good quality farmland and inadequate infrastructure – water capacity is cited as an example).

For Barton Hill Drive the objections focused on the Highway / traffic flow impacts for the local road network and for the strategic road network, the impact on local infrastructure, including health and schools and the environmental impact, including the loss of greenspace

1. Can you give further details of your plans to cover the funding gap of £17.5m to complete the M2 Junction 5 improvements.

In addition to Kent County Council's (KCC) and Swale Borough Council's £2.5 million contribution to the scheme, a bid is being worked up for the remaining gap funding from the Major Road Network (MRN) through the shadow Sub-National Transport Body (STB) – Transport for the South East (TfSE). **Highways England** is preparing an Outline Business Case (OBC) to submit to TfSE for prioritisation within its list of potential MRN schemes across the South East which it will submit to the Department for Transport (DfT) in a priority order following the meeting of the TfSE shadow Board in June. It will then be for the DfT to decide which MRN schemes receive funding for delivery in the 2020 to 2025 period. Although M2 Junction 5 is part of the Strategic Road Network (SRN) and is a committed scheme in the Road Investment Strategy (RIS), it is at the interface of the SRN with the MRN (A249 south of Stockbury roundabout is MRN) and therefore the benefits of a flyover of this roundabout are to both the A249 northbound (SRN) and A249 southbound (MRN) as well to the interchange with the M2.

One of the primary objectives of the MRN is to support the SRN (alongside reducing congestion, supporting economic growth and rebalancing, supporting housing delivery and supporting all road users), which this scheme at the interface of the SRN and MRN, will achieve; therefore should be eligible for funding. If successful, funding will be released in the early part of the programme (2021/22).

Notwithstanding the above, if further details of plans to cover the funding gap are required, then we defer to Highways England because delivery of the M2 J5 improvements is a Highways England scheme.

2. Modelling : Where is the demand forecasting report, which would accompany the LMVR. Where are the TUBA data quantified and monetised.

SWECO did not produce a demand forecasting report, but did produce a note outlining the modelling scenarios and key assumptions. There is some other detail about the modelling approach adopted in Chapter 4 of the Economic Appraisal Report. Both documents are attached.

3. Transport external costs: Please could you provide a detailed breakdown of the total NPV, PVB, PVC over the appraisal period for specifically each of these dependencies (Scenario S vs P and Scenario R vs S).

In the attached Economic Appraisal Report we have presented (see Tables 5.1 and 6.1) a breakdown of all the present values of the costs and benefits under each of the two scenarios over the appraisal period.

Thanks for the call yesterday and I hope some of the detail was of use.

As requested, I have attached a couple of drawings for both the Key Street and Grovehurst Road schemes that shows the outline of the proposals and the land ownership. There are, I understand, 4 affected landowners at each location and our Agents have written to all, providing them with the initial proposals for comment. To date, we have had responses back pertaining to Grovehurst Road which indicate a high level of support for the scheme and a willingness to be involved in any future engagement exercises which will be routinely undertaken.

As for Key Street, and considering the lack of response so far, I will be making direct contact with the individuals to seek their opinions and also a meeting to discuss the emerging design. This will extend to wider engagement with the Parish Councils and the public in due course.

The aim is to agree any land by negotiation and early indications are that this will be positive, however, if these negotiations did not succeed, then CPO's will be required. In the current Programme, we have identified dates for planning screening opinion and consent to be obtained although I am keen to prepare the documentation for CPO's at an early stage so the construction programme remains unaffected. A copy of the programme is also attached for ease of reference.

Within the team here at KCC, we have a Project Manager who specialises in the processes of land acquisition and he will be taking both the CPO preparation and screening opinion forward so that we may work towards the desired contract award and construction timeframes as identified within the current programme. In the meantime, our Agents will be commissioned next week to enter in to negotiations with Land owners so the necessary legal agreements can be put in place.

With regard to the discussion regarding a roundabout to the south of Grovehurst Road, on reflection, I wonder if this is in fact the developer led construction of a roundabout on Chestnut Street that Adam had referred to? There is such a proposal that sits outside of the HIF ask and is due to be delivered by the developer and I have asked for a position statement from both Swale Officers and my colleague in the Development Planning team. My understanding is that if the developer is not in a position to construct the roundabout when phase 2 of Key Street commences, then KCC would install a T junction on Chestnut Street to facilitate the access required. The closure of the existing southbound onslip and construction of the new onslip could then be programmed around the roundabout construction or, alternatively, KCC may elect to undertake the roundabout construction on behalf of the developer providing the s106 monies are secured to enable us to do so.

In respect to KCC undertaking works "at risk" in order to move the schemes forward, the intention is that the schemes are funded by the HIF ask and that s106 monies are recycled as and when they are received. This has been set out in the Bid documents. KCC are in a position to progress the signalisation of the Key Street northbound offslip as s106 monies have been forthcoming but we would not be in a similar position to deliver the rest of the Key Street proposals or indeed, the Grovehurst Road improvements without the HIF funding.

I have noticed that the proposed telephone call on Monday morning has been declined and wondered if there were any specific reasons for this, could you advise please?


We have considered the proposed transport appraisal methodology set out in your Summary of Transport Approach attachment and received comments from MHCLG and DfT economists, which have been incorporated below.

With your business case submission, you are requested to include evidence which demonstrates housing dependency on each infrastructure component on a site-by-site basis, for example in your explanation of how you decided on an appropriate Do Less option. You are reminded that those assessing your bid will only have the information included within it in front of them; for example, it would be useful to describe the M2 J5 scheme along with its impacts, and explain its relationship with your promoted HIF scheme. You are advised that considerably more weight would be placed on an approach to determining dependency following WebTAG A2.2 than it being based on a previous planning inspector's report on the local plan.

In terms of transport modelling, the approach set out looks generally reasonable. Where you use the VISSIM model in assessing the level of service under different development levels, it is noted this will need to incorporate outputs from a range of runs (from different random seed values), as well as demonstrating the consistency of response between VISSIM and the Saturn model. It would be useful if you could confirm whether this model also includes the B2006 junction with the A249 (between the two junctions proposed to be improved with HIF).

We have considered the proposed transport appraisal methodology set out in your Summary of Transport Approach attachment and received comments from MHCLG and DfT economists, which have been incorporated below.

With your business case submission, you are requested to include evidence which demonstrates housing dependency on each infrastructure component on a site-by-site basis, for example in your explanation of how you decided on an appropriate Do Less option. You are reminded that those assessing your bid will only have the information included within it in front of them; for example, it would be useful to describe the M2 J5 scheme along with its impacts, and explain its relationship with your promoted HIF scheme. You are advised that considerably more weight would be placed on an approach to determining dependency following WebTAG A2.2 than it being based on a previous planning inspector's report on the local plan.

In terms of transport modelling, the approach set out looks generally reasonable. Where you use the VISSIM model in assessing the level of service under different development levels, it is noted this will need to incorporate outputs from a range of runs (from different random seed values), as well as demonstrating the consistency of response between VISSIM and the Saturn model. It would be useful if you could confirm whether this model also includes the B2006 junction with the A249 (between the two junctions proposed to be improved with HIF).
