## THE HEART OF THE SOUTH WEST LEP GETTING BUILDING FUND

The Government is making £900 million available through the new Getting Building Fund (GBF) for investment in local, shovel-ready infrastructure projects to stimulate jobs and support economic recovery across the country. **The Heart of the South West** has been allocated **£35.4m** from the GBF for a wide-ranging package of projects that will deliver a much-needed boost to the local economy.

In the Heart of the South West, the funded projects are expected to deliver strategically key infrastructural improvements to the South Devon highway to unlock 2000sqm of office and industrial space; reenergise Plymouth's city centre to support the University of Plymouth, national rail companies and transport police; capitalise on the region's environmental assets to support a green educational infrastructure and highlight the region's potential as a centre for eco-tourism; build on an internationally renowned engineering sector and provide Exeter Airport with a skills academy to adapt to the loss of Flybe; support digital innovation in Somerset by providing high quality support and a 3000sqm digital innovation centre; deliver green homes and retrofits as part of an ambitious sustainability programme; and strengthen its education and skills sectors to ensure the Heart of the South West's economy is properly serviced and talent retained. This fund provides the key to the region's vision for a clean and inclusive recovery.
